Dear Sir: How two men differ N. Avery, Delhi, N Y, had two houses painted two ways; the houses alike, same painter, differ ent paints. One paint 6 gallons; the other 12.
A dealer there who was selling the $12 \cdot$ gallon paint, threw it out and put in the 6 -gallon paint. Do you see why? The less gallons paint cost less for the job by 6 gallons of paint and 6 days labor: $\$ 10.75$ for paint and $\$ 12$ to $\$ 24$ for labor (according to paintra' wages $\$ 2$ to $\$ 4$ a day.

The answer is (if you figure right) taking wages $\$ 2$ a day : A man could afford to but-on tha paint if somebody pays him $12 \%$ cents a gallon; and, taking wages $\$ 4$ a day, he must get $\$ 1.21$ a gallon.
