## Remarkable Increase in Produc

 tion of 1910 Compared With 1909(Continued from Last Week) corn
Our corn crop ranks second in value. Our corn acreage in 1910 was $8,800,000$ and production 181,280,000 bushels and had a farm value of $8114,206,000$. This corn was raised in 120 days, making an average production of approximately one million dollars per day. This ilustrates the increase in product ion in 1910 over 1909, showing a net increase of 5.6 bushels per acre.
The increase amounts, approximately, $\$ 36,000,000$, and is equal to ten times the total appropria. tions made by the 31 st legisletur for the annual support of Government for all purposes. The corn crop for 1909 and 1910 will, aceording to the raiiroad Commiesion's valuatien of railroad oroperty, more than purchase all the railroads in Texas. This giant industry has scarcely begun development. Corn can be successfully grown through. out the entire state; the possibilities of extending the corn area and of increasing yield per acre pre sent a wide field for agricul. tural activities.
The Farmers' institutes, Boys corn clubs and bulletins sent out
by the A. \& M. College and the Agricultural Department hav undoubtedly had a large in fluence on this increase per acr yisld.

Our whent. ane crop ranks third in 1910 . Our wheat acreage in 1910 was 1, 252,000; production 18,780,000 bushels with a farm value of $\$ 18,404,000$. The production per acre 1909 with 1910 show an increase this year last of 6 bushels per acre.
The increase in production per acre amounts to approximately $\$ 6,000,000$. We show an increase in area harvested 1910 over 1909 of 126 per cent, and an increase in yield per acre of 67 per cent which makes a remarkable shoxstill importers of wheat. The world average in 1909 was ove one half acre per capita, and we narrowly averted a bread famine the Texas average in 1910 , whic is by far the best year we have had, was less than one-third of an acre per capita. There is food for thought in these figures agricultural department.
