 Hon. B. F. Dent B. F. Dent,Crockett, Texas Dear Sir: In reply

## asking for a construction of the

 special road law for Houston County, I beg to say that fromyour letters and also the letter from your county clerk, I ob fact that Section 1 of said law quires the County Commission ers of your county to appoint road superintendent at its firs regular meeting after said law became effective that they have failed to do so, and also that an election has been held under Section 32 of said act and the office of superintendent of roads and bridges has been abolished. The inquiry you make seems
to hinge on the proper construc ion of Section 9 of said act, which provides in substance that all contract work done on your county shall be bridges of your county shall be paid for by
the county treasurer out of the road and bridge fund on voucher audited and approved by the
Commissioners Court.
that it an said law provides that it shall be cumulative of all general laws not in conflict with

Now there are a number o provisions of said law relating o the duties of the county road superintendent but they most genarally provide that these du ties are to be performed with th advice and consent of the com missioner's court and with their
approval, there never having been approval, there never having been a county road superintendent appointed under the provisions of said law and the office having with the provisions accordance of the opinion that it is the duty of the commissioner's court perform the several duties required of the county superinten dent in said law and that in pay ing for work done on the public roads and bridges out of the road and bridge fund, the ac on and approved by be passed missioner's court and that a war rant therefor should be issued by the county clerk which should be paid by the county treasurer The provision in said Section 9 requiring the county superintendent to audit and approve ac counts for work done on publie roads, becomes inoperative, or rather remains inoperative intil the appointment of such oft such officer
