showing this country has ever made, yet by no means do we derive all our revenue from this source. We ship annually lots of peas, hides, chickens, eggs "raised on the farm." The fig. "raised on the farm." The fig. ures these products represent in actual cash areastounding. For
instance, during January and February 5,600 bushels of peas have been sold. The average price paid was $\$ 1.35$-per bushel,
making a total of $\$ 7,560$, and all the peas have not been market ed yet.
But here is where the good farmer's wife comes in and shows how she pays the family grocery bill every month. Here
to-fore Grapeland has always lead in egg shipments and the first two months of this year shows that she is not likely to fall behind past records. Apeggs have been shipped since January 1. The average price can safely be placed at 22 c per dozen, bringing the total up to $\$ 2,052.60$ received from the sale shipped in the same length of time adds more to the community's pocket-book. The total number of fowls, which includes
