think so, as our court house was think so, as our court house was
burned and records lost. Then there will be no records unless
you can make them out. Can you not? Will you not try to do this before it is too late? You
owe this in justice to yourselves, your posterity and to your coun ty, from which, as young men you volunteeved to-leave your
homes, your loved ones and all homes, your loved ones and al
the comforts of life, answering to the call of duty, when your
state made the call to arms, for the defense of your homes, your rights. I have a list of the com. panies that went from Houston county answering this call, which can furnish you.

The first company that an swered the call of the state for olunteers was composed young men, about thirty number, who, with samenumber from Nacogdoches, Anderson and Rusk counties, formed a gal enlisted in the service enlisted in the service April, 1861.
