WOULD NOT NEED MUCH LAND
When the farmers learn how much moisture they can hold in the ground by means of the "soil-mulch," and how long they can hold it in, there will be less praying for rain.
However, one cannot make as good a soil-mulch on a big field, as I have on my water-melon patch, because nobody, I believe can make as good a mulch with the plow, as may be made with he hoe.
But any man who knows how can make a good enough soilmulch with the plow unless he has more land than he can get to at the right time after a rain. If the farmer knows enough to work into his soil such things as ot manure, stalk-litter, pea-litter, etc., and to prepare a good deep bed to catch the moisture, and then to make the right sort of then to make the right sort of oild-mulch at the right time, to need much land, especially if it is sandy land.
I mean that he will not requir much in cultivation. Of cours if he can have plenty of pasture on which to grow good stock, make money while he sleeps, and help to keep up the fertility of his cult
