Moisture is often the determining factor between success and failure with crops in many localities of the South west. In rain perhaps more than would ordinarily be needed for large ordinarily be needed for large
crops if it ware distribe crops if it ware distributed over the growing season when needed. But it may rain when we do not need it and drouth overtake us when we need rain. The farmer's problem under such conditions is to break, plant and cultivate in such a way that the moiscrops may be conserved for his Practical farmers know that soil with a large per cent of veg
etable matter, soil that is deep well pulverized, mellow and fria-
ble, will retain moisture better than "dead," close, shallow soil that favors a large per cent "run oin moisture. The problem,
then, is to till the soil in such way that moisture will be re ained for the use of plants whe there is a drouth. This is not
always possible. The best one can do in seasons of drouth is to keep the soil cultivated so
that enough moisture may be saved to keep the plants grow

## SCHOOL OPENS SEPT. 17

At a meeting of the board of trustees of Grapeland Independ ent School District held Tues day afternoon, it was decided to open school September 17 and continue for a term of 9 months.
In order to continue the school nine months it was found necessary to make the first month, beginning September 17 and ending October 12 , a pay month at the following prices per pupil:' Primary, including first four grade, $\$ 1.50$.
Intermediate, including 5th, 6 th and 7 th grades, $\$ 2.00$. High school, including 8th, 9th, 10th and 11th grades, $\$ 2.50$.
The board requests parents who have children under the scholastic age, that is, children not seven years old by September 1st, to enter them during the first three weeks. If they do not enter them during this time, please wait until mid-term. This request is made to keep down so many divisions in the primary classes.
The board also set November 5th as the date to put into effect the compulsory attendance law to continue for 80 consecutive days. This date is the same as
has been agreed on by the trus. tees of the county.
The trustees are to be congratulated for the efforts they are making to have the school become a school of the firstclass. They have arranged for three teachers to do high school work exelusively, have arranged for a term of nine months, and have
instructed the superintendent to instructed the superintendent to
confer with the state department as to further requirements for firstclass classification.
