The advantage ff this smearing action of the drag will be more readily under stood if a sample of ordinary earth is examined under a mag-
nifying glass. Such an examinifying glass. Such an examination will show that the earth closely resembles a sponge honeycomb in structure, and the desirability of closing the open pores will be readily apparent If used improperly or at the If used improperly or at the
wrong time, the drag may do actual injury to a road. Dragging a very dry road, for example, serves to increase the quantity of dust and may do additional damage by destroying the seal king. If during previous dragroad is very wet and muddy the icresularities in the surface are likely to be increased rather than diminished by dragging.
