San Jose Scale May Be
Driven From Fruit Trees
"The San Jose' Scale and its Control,"which is Farmers Bulletin 650, just issued in revised form by the United States Department of Agrigulture, ains a description of the insect its natural history and habits, means of distribution, food plants, means of distribution, food plants natural enemies and, most important of all, ways of controlling it. Attacking, as it does, practically all deciduous fruit trees, this minute insect is one of the most generally dreaded pests with which the fruit grower has to contend.
The bulletin says that the insect can be kept well in check by thorough annual treatment during the period when the plants are dormant, and full instuctions are given as to how treatment should be applied. The various washes are discussed and conditions outlined under which one may be preferable to the others.
