



However, you might need to know that they are also making inroads into the cattle industry. Between 50 to 100 million dollars have been invested in U.S. cattle ranches, feedlots and packing plants since 1987. Shipments of domestic beef to Japan have risen sharply in the last two years. At the end of last year, foreigners controlled about 12.5 million acres of this country's privately owned farmland and timberland. Still, that is only about one per cent of the real estate and farmland in the U.S. We have invested far more in other countries than this. But we need to be on the alert for any future political influence these foreign investors may wield with their new American dollars, lest we someday end up with riceburgers in place of the Big Mac. 


JR. SKILLS...Friona's junior skills team placed first in district. Seated are Jason Wright and Kyle Potts. Clint Hurst is standing.


