Moonlight and starlight are no longer sufficient illumination for natural scenic beauties. Nigara Falls something when I heard you has been put on a night schedule by means of an elab-orate lighting system which sets off the mighty "Oh Mr Brokenbler" cataract at night with neww glories of color and Mrs. Ballew. "will you ever forgiv light. Recently Natural Bridge, Va., has been given similar attention. A 7,000,000 candlepower system of red, amber and purple lights has been installed. The whole is dimmed and brightened by control switches, so a constantly changing propagana greets the evening visitor. The Natural Bridge is a stone arch 60 feet wide which spans a river at a height of 240 feet. The bridge and its setting make a beautiful picture. They are of historical interest as well. It may seem a little incongruous to have such wonders hemmed about by electric lighting systems. Yet it is true that the artificial illumination has augmented the glory of the spectacles at Niagara Falls and at Natural Bridge, and has made them enjoyable in additional ways. So long as the lighting equipment does not obtrude upon the natural loveliness of such scenes in the daytime, but remains artificially concealed, its installation is a good thing. Other natural wonders will undoubtedly be so illuminated in time.


