WOODFIN GETS FURLOUGH TO BRING IN WELL

AUSTIN, Texas, June 7.—A. H. Woodfin, serving a sentence imposed in Shackelford county for murder, has been granted a 30-day furlough by Gov. Dan Moody to permit him to aid the Crater Oil company in bringing in an oil well in East Texas. Woodfin having been at the time of his conviction the company's consulting engineer and geologist. It was stipulated in the furlough proclamation that Woodfin is to be accompanied by a guard.

It was represented to the government that Woodfin, who was instrumental in the organization of the Crater Oil company, prepared the plans of the company for development of oil in East Texas and that he alone had technical knowledge as to leads shown in the survey. The claim was made that the well now being drilled will be ruined if the assistance of Woodfin is not obtained.

Woodfin was sentenced to five to thirty years. Gov. Miriam A. Ferguson on the last day of her administration reduced the sentence to five years.

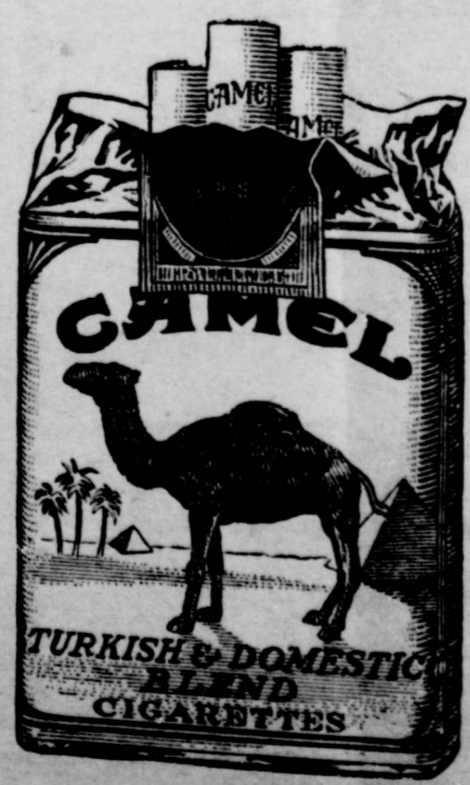


