CRIMINAL CARELESSNESS

A two-year-old boy, playing in his grandmoth- Elimination! er's pleasant yard, suddenly came into the house uttering screams of pain. Even as the family gathered about him to seek the cause of his agony his face became inflamed. A visitor said she smelled carbolic acid. The babe was too hurt and terrified to tell what had happened, but his playmate said they had found a "bottle of water in the back yard and Dicky had washed his face with the water." It proved to have been a bottle of carbolic acid which a neighbor had discarded by merely throwing it out with some other rubbish. Perhaps two-year-old children should be so intelligent and well trained that they won't touch anything but their own familiar toys. We wonder. But what about the criminal carelessness of a person who allows a dangerous substance of any sort to lie around? Suppose the baby had felt thirsty? His face and hands were terribly burned and the doctor who attended him is not certain yet how serious the burns may prove. If the child had swallowed the "water" he would in all probability have died before the doctor's arrival. Dangerous drugs and acids have no place in the ordinary home. If they have been needed and used under a doctor's instructions, the left-overs should be destroyed. Just throwing them into a basket or out into the back yard is wicked and dangerous negligence. There should be some severe penalty for such carelessness

SOVIET MANNERS AND MORALS

Great Britain, long tolerant of Soviet Russia, and one of the first powers to recognize the Soviet government, breaks off diplomatic relations and kicks Russia out. France, desirous of preserving diplomatic relations if possible, warns Russia that "it will oppose with all its powers Communistic influences within France." These acts, following close upon the repudiation of the Soviet influence in China, are severe blows to Russian prestige. Moscow answers them, as usual, with bluster, denial and threat. But it does little good. There is pretty widespread sympathy with the action of the three great countries which have rebuked the Soviet government, and efforts at Moscow and elsewhere to becloud the issue do not accomplish much. The red Muscovites would have the world believe that there is an international conspiracy to persecute Russia and interfere with her having the kind of government she wants. The truth is that the Soviet leaders in Russia have insisted on interfering in other countries, spreading propaganda, sending secret emissaries and laboring for the spread of Communism. Naturally the other countries resent that. Russia may have any kind of political and economic system she wants, if she will keep it to herself. Other countries are not meddling in Russia. Other countries will welcome Russia to international association if Russia will be decent in her international conduct. All that is wanted of the Soviet government is that, with




