The mayor declared that Cisco is already in fair shape in so far as sanitation is concerned, but that much can be done to improve the appear ance of the city before the thousands of visitors arrive here for the gala day. Many of the visitors are potential future citizens of Cisco, the mayor asserted, and if Cisco can make the sort of impres-

pable of making, then many of them will likely move here. The mayor urged that every lawn in Cisco be properly cut and cleaned off before July 22, and all trash and rubbish be hauled away. Those houses, especially the business houses needing paint, should be looked after at once it was asserted, and fences and other portions of property should be placed in repair. The mayor urged that vacant lots be cleared of all weeds and rubbish, and asked that all old signs that are weather beaten and unsightly be re moved. All these measures, if looked after in the next few weeks before the celebration. will leave an impression on the visitors that will linger in their minds and keep up Cisco's reputation of being the clean-

MORE PHONE CALLS MADE LAST YEAR

Why does the average number of telephone calls per day show such an increase in the last few

The answer, according to P. district manager of the Southwestern Bell Telephone company, is the gain in the number of telephones. During 1926 there was a net gain of 781,000 telephones owned and operated by the Bell System. During the same period the total number of exchange telephone calls over the Bell System wires increased by 1,091,000,000 over the year 1925, and the number of toll and long distance calls increased 90,500,000. As each new telephone is added, that brings the system in contact with just so many more patrons and, therefore, makes it more valuable and use ful to the public.

There are more telephone calls, therefore, from year to year and from day to day because more telephones are placed in operation. but this is not the only reason the telephone is constantly grow ing in public use, for along with the increase in its facilities, there has been a corresponding improvement in service. This improvement during 1926 was particularly marked as is evidenced by the fact that the number of exchange plant troubles per unit was reduced 17


