Eternal penca to of study at Texas A. & M. colsummer," declared E. H. Varnell, Cisco agricultural expert, who has just returned bome from three weeks of study at College Station. He spent most of his time at the college in study of conomic entymology, learning the best methods of control of various crop pests, with special attention to boll weevils. Mr. Varnell said me entirely new thoughts were ought out during the study, one of which seems destined to revo utionize the ideas heretofore held on poisoning boll weevils. Investias proved that poisoning which does not have prospects of at least a third of a bale to the acre, he said he was told. Also, experts declared that poisoning can be done just as effectively in the day time as at night. Heretofore it had been held that poison would do no good unless applied when the plants were damp, which only happens at night. It has been found that minute hair like substances on the leaves will catch and hold poison sufficient to kill the insects, Varnell said

### FIGURES SHOW LOCAL POOL IS AHEAD OF ALL

Cisco's swimming pool, when completed, will be the largest in the world. This fact was authenticated Tuesday by a letter received by the Cisco chamber of commerce from Gantner & Mattern Co., of San Francisco, Calif., whose business of supplying bathing suits to swimming pools throughout the country has placed them in position to know. The Cisco pool, 267 feet wide by 700 feet long, will overtop the pool hereto LONDON. June 28. - Chaliap fore regarded as the largest in the world by 36,900 square feet of area. The Fleishhacker pool at San Francisco, claim ant to the title of the largest swimming pool in the world at only 150 feet wide, the letter stated, containing, therefore. an area of 150,000 square feet. The Cisco pool has an area of 186,900 square feet.

Following is the letter which answered an inquiry from the chamber of commerce:

"We were rather startled by the figures 267x700 feet. Your swimming pool will certainly cover the largest square foot area that we have ever heard of, and, as we furnish rental swimming suits to pools throughout the country, we believe that we are in position to know whereof we speak.

"About two years ago the Fleishhacker pool was opened in San Francisco, then the largest swimming pool in the world - 1,000 feet in length by 150 feet in width. We enclose herewith photo postcard

of the Fleishhacker pool. "Cisco is to be congratulattinction for a city to have the largest swimming pool in the world. Your letter was of such interest to us that we have passed it on to .Ernest M. 

### One Ship Forced to Return After First Eight Minutes, But Army's Plane Heads Straight for Honolulu

OAKLAND, Calif., June 28 .- Lieuts. Maitland and Hegenberger in their army plane was reported sighted at 10:25 a. m. by an unknown ship 300 miles at sea, according to an army radio message. They had been sighted at 8 a. m. 108 miles at sea by the army transport American Legion.






