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NO MORE STUDENT AUTOS

The University of Michigan, after milder methods to control student automobiles, banished them from now on except in very special instances. A resolution adopted by the board of regents says: "No student in attendance at the university from and after the beginning of the first semester the coming fall shall operate any motor vehicle. In exceptional and extraordinary cases, in the discretion of the dean of students, this rule may be relaxed."

THE ARMAMENT CONFERENCE

It is well not to expect too much of the three-power naval conference at Geneva, called at the invitation of the United States. With France and Italy taking no official part, it is impossible to take any action binding those powers. It is to be remembered, too, that the League of Nations, after long struggle with the disarmament problem, has been unable to agree on a program. Still, it is well to meet and discuss the proposals of the three powers, whether any of them are adopted or not.

HARLINGEN BUILDS ROOM HOTEL

HARLINGEN, June 28.—Construction of a modern 12-story hotel is to begin here soon, according to plans announced by A. L. Lewis and the Metropolitan Investment corporation of Harlingen. Site for the new building has been obtained on a 90-year lease, involving a consideration of \$300,000. The building, which is to be the largest in the valley, will be constructed by a syndicate of Cleveland and Dallas men, representing one of the country's largest hotel concerns. It will be built of steel, concrete and brick, and will contain from 250 to 300 rooms, according to plans. The first four stories will be occupied by a branch of one of the largest department stores in the south.

STATE OF MINNESOTA COLLECTS BIG TAX; ESTATE OF LADY STRATHCONA

ST. PAUL, Minn., June 28.—The state treasurer has received a check for \$62,147 the inheritance tax on the estate of the late Lady Strathcona of Scotland. The tax was paid on inheritance of 8,000 shares of Great Northern preferred stock valued at approximately \$905,000 and 57,955 shares of Great Northern Ore property valued at \$1,133,968, or a total of \$1,738,968 of the estate in Minnesota. The estate, totalling some \$28,000,000 was left mostly to two sons and two daughters. The Rt. Hon. Margaret Strathcona of Mt. Royal, province of Quebec, was the daughter of the late first Lord Strathcona. Donald Alexander, one of the original backers of the late James J. Hill, known as the "empire builder."

CHALIAPIN WRITES EPITAPH TELLING ABOUT HIS SINS

LONDON, June 28.—Chaliapin, the great Russian basso, has composed his own epitaph. "I have drawn it up in Russian," he told interviewers here. "In English it would be something like this: 'Here is the grave of Chaliapin. He lived, he loved and he did scandalous things. He lied and committed sins unspeakable. He was like the devil. Now he lies under this stone. His tomb is watered only by the tears of his wife and children. Eternal peace to your remains, Chaliapin, actor, artist, and man who sold himself to all people.'"

100 BOOKS FOR BLIND IN STATE LIBRARY

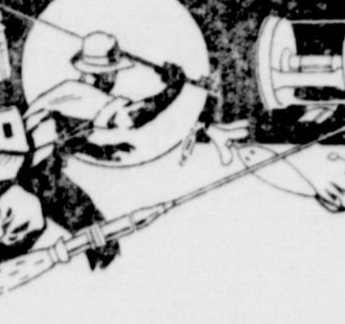

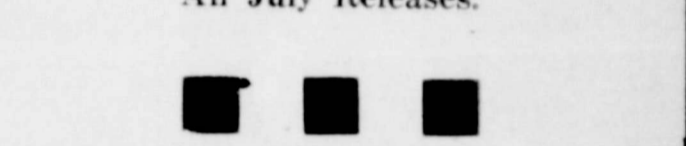
