Flyer Will Attempt Round Trip From Hawaii; Gets Off After Third Effort to Get Into the Air

OAKLAND, Calif., July 14.-Urged on by the idea of being the first Canadian to fly to Honolulu and to be the first to fly back again, Ernest Smith, air mail pilot, in his silver monoplane "City of Oakland" took off at 10:40 a. m. today on the second great aerial adventure over the Pacific within two weeks. Ernest Bronte, navigator, accompanied Smith. It was the third attempt of Smith to get away, and the second today. Yet perhaps the birds shouldn't be blamed. Birds have suffered enough from cats to justify a reprisal now and then. These particular blackbirds may have had a just grievance against the feline tribe. And there can be no certainty that Mitzi herself was guiltless. Many a cat, basking by the fire or sunning herself on the lawn, with every appearance of righteousness, becomes a raving beast at night. Many an innocent looking cat prowls about by day pouncing upon unsuspecting birds and robbing nests. For this reason, bird-lovers more and more are refusing to have cats about their places and are trying to eliminate them from the whole neighborhood.
