Prominent Texans Praise Cisco For Courage in Building Lake Projects; Many to Be Here For Celebration

Letters of acceptance and regrets received by the chamber of commerce in answer to invitations sent out to prominent persons over the state to attend the Lake Cisco celebration here Friday include many words of praise for the Cisco projects. Perhaps none was more interesting than that sent by President J. L. Lancaster of the Texas & Pacific railroad, who wrote:

"I much appreciate the invitation extended to me to attend the celebration at Cisco on July 22, on the occasion of the dedication of the highest concrete highway structure in the southwest, the largest artificial swimming pool and the completion of the state's fish hatchery there.
