BRITISH AND AMERICAN WARSHIPS

There has been considerable misunderstanding, it seems, about American and British naval policies as represented at the Geneva conference, with much argument about cruisers, of which Britain has far more than we have, and with a feeling on the part of Americans that Britain wants to outbuild us in total fighting power. The whole thing, however, was put in a reassuring way by a recent statement of W. C. Bridgeman, first lord of the British admiralty. He is quoted as saying: "Our policy has been to state frankly what are the British requirements, but we never dispute the American claim for parity as established by the Washington treaty. It is true we think our special needs demand a higher number of vessels, but we do not deny the right of the United States to build up to an equal figure in any type of warship, if she thought necessary."

MARGOT LOOSE AGAIN

Margot Asquith—"Lady Asquith," if you insist on titular correctness—has broken loose again with a new book. Margot will be remembered as the English woman who has risen to fame by her free use of a gift for saying unpleasant things about other people. Her latest production, as usual, is as full of unpleasantness and indiscretions as a rice pudding is of raisins, but this one sample of her style may suffice. She tells how "women with neither backs nor tops to their heads, and faces as large as hams, appear at the king's drawing rooms with the nuque of their necks blue from shaving." We should think that would rather shock a mild person like King George. Just imagine a lot of women flocking around you with hair faces and nothing else visible above the neck, something like the smile of the Cheshire Cat in "Alice in Wonderland" after the cat had vanished. And then that "blue nuque of the neck," whatever it may be—wouldn't you think they'd at least dust on a little powder, as a man does in similar circumstances? But to think of a British subject—raised to be a "lady" by the king, too—coming right out with such exposures of the kind of womenfolk who dare to flock around majesty! To revert again to "Alice in Wonderland," the rough-and-ready rule of the duchess is the only one: "Off with her head!"

A TOWN WITH NO HOT DOGS

A village without a hot dog stand is rare in these days. For that reason, Scarsdale, N. Y., a suburb of the metropolis, deserves a little special notice. The village board recently passed an ordinance, without a dissenting vote, banning from its environs hot dog stands, peanut vendors and other sellers of gastronomic atrocities. The idea, apparently, is the protection of the stomachs of the school boys and girls of the town. Between-meal snacks purchased at the hot dog and cold drink stands were found to be disastrous to the health, study and athletic prowess of high school students. It may be taken for granted that both the refreshment purveyors and the protected youngsters are somewhat put out about this. But perhaps it is all for the best. It is hoped nobody starts bootlegging these forbidden viands into the community.

PARIS IN 24 HOURS, PLAN

NEW YORK, July 21.—The recent transoceanic non-stop flights will narrow down from epochal events to the level of a monotonous street-car ride if R. Rex Renee's ambitious plans for an airplane trip that will send a thrill-loving world into ineffable ecstasy materialize.

Renee, sales manager for an electric company and he says, an experienced aviator, not only harbors the belief that it is possible to make a non-stop round-trip flight between New York and Paris, but expects to accomplish this stupendous undertaking within the next few months.

Furthermore, he blandly asserts, he anticipates making the flight to Paris and return in 24 hours, a little more than half the time required for the trans-Atlantic trips that were only half the distance he expects to cover.

Ready In September  
In September, Renee says, he will take off on his ambitious flight in a special airplane equipped with two special 1,250 horsepower Packard motors using a special fuel he himself has invented.

The plane as he describes it would shove the present type into the same background to which the horse-and-buggy were relegated by the automobile, one would judge.

It will have a cruising speed of 300 miles an hour with a maximum speed of 375 miles an hour, Renee declares. Where is this super-plane? It is being built. Where

is it being built? Renee would not say.

Is Expert Aviator  
Renee says he was born in France and is a graduate of Oxford university. During the world war, he recites, he was a colonel of the famous Lafayette Escadrille and he claims the distinction of having been the fourth ranking flying ace of the entire conflict with forty enemy planes to his credit.

He would not make known the nature of the new fuel he says he has invented but volunteered the information that it is concentrated in small tubes and that the mixing of the tube in a specified quantity of water would result in a fuel that would enable an airplane to travel at a greater speed than any yet attained.

His plane, Renee asserts, will not carry gasoline, but water, instead, and when he is in need of fuel he will merely drop a tube of fuel into the water.

NEW SAHARA BEING FORMED  
That the Argentine will have a Sahara of its own is shown in reports to the ministry of agriculture of France. An extensive region north of the province of Neuquen is rapidly drying up, and rivers and springs are disappearing. Great dust storms are sweeping over the country and at times sand dunes form quickly and engulf the few remaining pastoral areas. The territory was once well populated by the Indians, but they have been driven away. A valley where formerly there were 4,000 cattlemen, now contains only a few hundred. The cost of digging canals and of irrigation work to save the region would be too expensive for the government to undertake.
