Whatever the reason, or how unreasonable it is, the fact remains that the recently unpopular Mr. Dempsey is now the idol of the fight fans, and the aloof Mr. Tunney has his popularity to maintain as well as his title.

HUMAN BROTHERHOOD



It, must be borne in mind that the amendment only gives the legislature authority to do certain things. It doesn't command it i do anything, much less does it di rect the countles as to what they shall do. The purpose of the amendment is to make it possible for the state to do away with the state tax on land and homes. To do this it must levy new kinds of taxes or levy old taxes in a new way. It is the contention of that counties should be left all taxes on real estate and the state supported from taxes on the intangible values of corporations. It corporation is making good profits it is worth a great deal mor than its physical property is worth A tax on this "intangible value"the amount over and above the value of its physical propert would be just under our present system, of course, but there is no machinery for assessing or collect ing such a tax, and it now goes collected. Such a tax has several advantages. It is assessed on ly when a corporation is really prosperous, it drops away when ever business prosperity slackens So it is always assessed only where it can easily be borne. It would be extremely hard to pass on to the consumer, because a profit-making concern is not going to run the risk of raising prices on its products solely to escape a


