



#### DEFEAT OF AMENDMENTS CERTAIN

On the eve of the election on the four proposed amendments to the state constitution, their defeat ap- fortunately they don't holler when you put them on pears most certain. It is always a difficult task to the hook. pass an amendment to our basic state law, and this difficulty is made doubly great in this instance because there is abroad in the state the feeling that the amendments were presented to the voters only "half baked." Regardless of the merits of the various amendments, there seems to have been no real demand for them, at least in their proposed form. There are many who believe our judiciary and tax systems need revision, but the amendments as proposed are so ambiguous or fall so far short of meeting the needs of the state that it is well that they be defeated and be re-submitted after careful study and an amendment campaign that will inform the voters on their necessity and merits. Once written into our constitution, the amendments would be there for a long, long time, and it is wise to get them like we want them, rather than be satisfied with only half of what we want.

#### TEXAS JOURNALISM SUFFERS LOSS

Texas journalism loses an outstanding figure in the promotion of Will C. Edwards, for 25 years publisher of the Denton Record-Chronicle, to the position of publisher of the Washington Herald. His many friends, both in the profession and out, will rejoice in his good fortune in becoming the guiding head of a great publication in the national capital city, but regret to see the departure of one of Texas' most successful ublishers, and a booster for all that worthwhile in Texas. For a quarter of a century the Denton editor, through the columns of his newspaper and in later years through public addresses, has encouraged progressive measures for the good of his home city and his native state. He has always been a particular friend to education and has done much to influence the laws of this state relating to development of an educational system. He is a veteran of many local campaigns for civic development, and his paper has always upheld measures for the good of the state. In recent years he has been most active in Rotary, and probably no Rotary governor has ever been quite so active in pushing forward the clubs of this state. For the past year he has traveled almost continuously over Texas and into the north for the sole benefit of Rotary whose motto of "Service above self" seemed ever present in his mind, even before Rotary came into prominence. Those of us who know "Bill" Edwards over a period of years know him as a conscientious worker and employer, an exeffect newspaper man, and a citizen any state should

proud to claim. Texas' loss is Washington's good fortune, and The Daily News joins in wishing "Big Bill" a success in his larger sphere commensurate with that he has had in his limited field in Denton.

In the week ending July 2, "revenue freight" on e railroads passed the million car mark for the welfth week in succession. The traffic since that date is said to be holding up. Total car loadings for the present year so far are nearly 300,000 cars more than they were a year ago. And 1926, it need hardly be added, was a good year. Freight traffic for the first five months of this year, according to figures just compiled, showed an increase of more than seven billion ton-miles, a gain of 4 per over the best previous record, made last year. 



PITTSBURG, July 30. - Will the achievement of Captain Chas A. Lindbergh last long in the minds of those who praise him

This question confronts one stark ly on visiting the Carnegie Musoum here. Within the building is another aeroplane and a picture of its pilot, the achievements both long since forgotten.

Galbraith Perry Rodgers was the pilot's name. But that stirs no memory in the mind of the average American today, mute testimony to the fickleness of the god dess of fame and fortune.

Rodgers startled the world away back in 1911 when he announced he would attempt a flight across the United States. On September 17 of the year he started. The flyer finished his "hop" on November 5, 1911. It took the then daring aviator 3 days, 10 hours and 4 minutes, actual flying time to

Wonderful Achievement a wonderful achievement in that day. And well it might have been, for no aviator today would dare venture into the all in the contraption Rodgers used The wings of the machine were flimsy. The wooden frame looks like it would crumple at a particularly strong puff of wind, and

Public Has Forgotten And that is all the public cares

about that flight today. A Sunday afternoon visitor at the museum overhears many amusing and some cryptic comments on the machine and its flyer. The significance, the importance of that early flight falls to register.

## HATTUER PAPER HITS CHANGE

Views of the Eastland County News, published at Ranger, on the proposal to move the Eastland county seat from Eastland to Carbon, are given in the following article appearing in the current week's issue of the paper:

hosen as the county seat instead of Eastland, the latest development is to the effect that calculations show that Eastland is within five miles of the Acographical center of the county and it would, therefore, require a two-thirds vote of the peo ple to vote the county seat.

The supporters of Carbon have been figuring that a bare majority was all that was required.

Petitions have been prepared and are being circulated in Carbon, Gorman and perhaps other towns asking the commissioners court to call an election to move the county seat from Eastland to Carbon.

From sentiment expressed in Ranger, the advocates of Carbon cannot muster a simple majority; and, as for two-thirds, that is out of the

Whether Eastland is in the exact center of the county geographically or not, it is certainly in the popul lation center and therefore is th most conveniently located for the majority of the people of the county. It is ten miles from Ranger. ten miles from Cisco and only four miles from Olden. Thirty thousand people of the 50,000 in Eastland county live in the four cities of Ranger, Olden, Eastland and Cisco, and are therefore within 20 minutes drive of the court house.

If the courthouse were moved Carbon, the hundreds of Ranger citizens who attend court as jurors witnesses and litigants and who go to the court house to file records would have to travel twice as far as they do now.

What advantage would it be the people of Ranger to have t make a round trip of 40 miles to get to the county seat instead of going 20 miles on the round trip, as they do now?

Carbon is a small, prosperous community, in good farming territory and with oil activity in progress. It has limited railroad facilities-one train a day each way on a branch railroad

To select a town of less than a thousand population for a county seat of a county that has 50,000 people, including three cities of approximately 10,000 each would cause laughter throughout the state.




