## GRAND JURORS | President Announces Momentous Decision With Single Sentence; Political Circles Put in Uproar

In a one-line sentence he made the following announcement to newspaper men called Monday in the special election on county grand jury today to testify for a special conference at the summer white house here at noon:

"I do not choose to run for president in 1928."

There was no amplification of the little written announcement. Each reporter received a copy on a slip of flimsy paper and Mr. Coolidge waved them out of the chamber, signifying the audience was at an end. At the regular conference at 9 o'clock this morning he had added at the end: "If you gentlemen will return at noon, I shall have a further announcement to make." The speculation generally backed up semiofficially had been that the statement would have to do with the impending failure of the naval conference at Geneva. Promptly at 12 o'clock, approximately twenty newspaper men were ushered into Mr. Coolidge's office. He stood waiting beside his desk until all were within and Secretary Everett Sanders had closed and barred the door. "Is every one there?" the president asked, and as the replies were given in he affirmative, he said: "I have here a little announcement. Will you gentlemen march by my desk in single file to receive it." As the importance of the announcement dawned on those in the first line, there was a wild dash for the door and the telegraph office,







