NEW YORK, Aug. 3 .- A sharp decline in leading speculative stocks was Wall Street's answer to President Coolidge's withdrawal from the presidential race. The markets today had the first opportunity to analyze the president's statement in declaring he did not "choose" to run in 1928, since his announcement Tuesday was held up until after the exchange had closed. The New York cotton market had its most exciting opening in months and initial losses of \$2.50 a bale were recorded in some of the active futures. 
