MILLIONS FOR TREES

New York City is going to spend \$1,000,000 for the rehabilitation of Central Park. This is said to be the largest sum ever appropriated for a public park anywhere. The money is to be spent mainly on trees, and for that purpose the work has been placed in charge of one of the most capable tree experts in the country. As an indication of what can be done, the park commissioner says that the expert employed saved, last year, 100 valuable trees that were dying. He did it by pruning them scientifically, administering "tree surgery" wherever it was needed either for lopping off surplus branches or the removal of decayed wood, and then feeding and watering the trees properly. Incidentally it was proved that the noxious gases from automobiles and chimneys, which were suspected of responsibility for killing trees, were not harming them at all, because the poison was not concentrated enough for that. 
