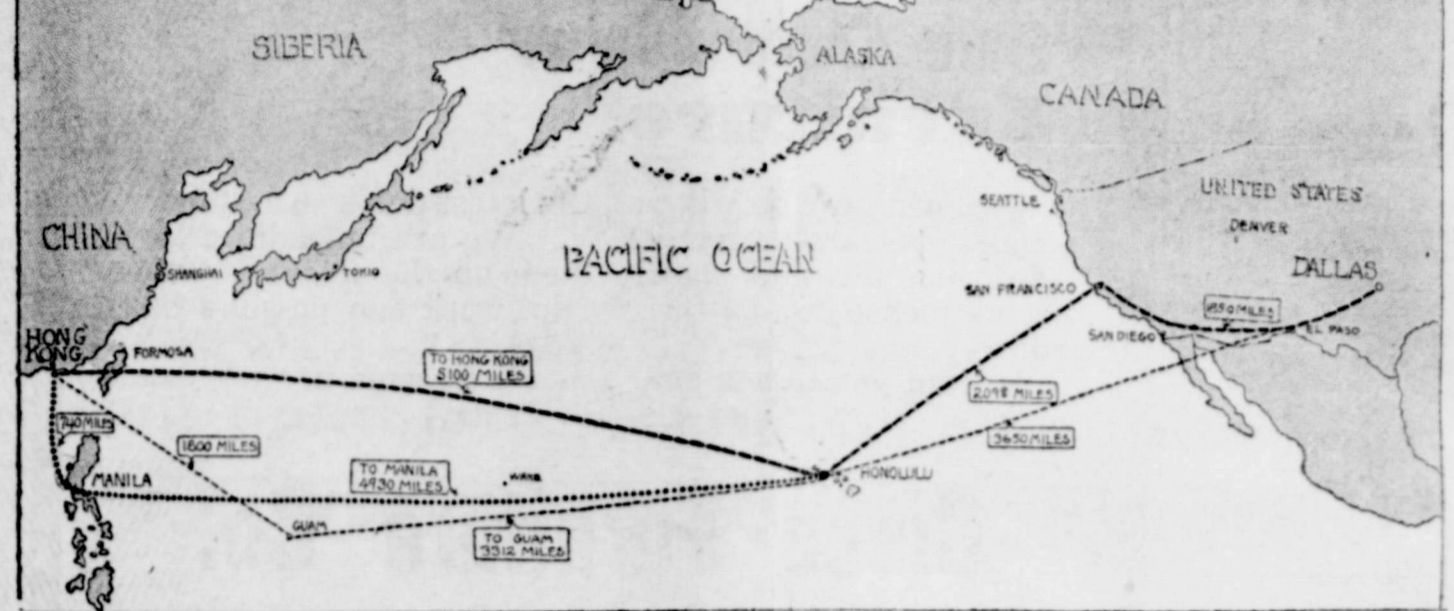
1600 TEXAS CORPORATIONS FACE OUSTER

Haskell Co. Road Bond Issue Fails

HASKELL, Aug. 8.—Advocates of paved highways through Haskell county lost today, for the second time, and it was a heart-breaking defeat. Heart-breaking because the margin was so small, only 82 votes.

Out of 2,588 votes counted from 19 of the 21 boxes of the county, on the proposal to issue \$1,500,000 in bonds for the hard surfacing of 115 miles on highways 39, 51, 18 and 120, the number for the bonds was 1,608, with 880 against. Two boxes are missing, Cottonwood and Joe Batley, but they are relatively small and cannot overturn the result.

WILD BUYING MARKS FIRST ESTIMATE OF YEAR WHICH SHOWS YIELD WILL BE MUCH SMALLER THIS YEAR THAN LAST

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—Following announcement of the first cotton report of the season by the crop reporting board of the United States department of agriculture which indicated this year's crop would fall one million bales less than that of last year, a wild buying movement began today.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—The United States cotton crop this year will be approximately 13,192,000 bales of 500 pounds grade weight, based upon a condition of 69 per cent of normal on August 1, the crop reporting board of the U. S. agriculture department announced today.

BOSTON, Aug. 8.—Attorney Arthur D. Hill today lost the first legal skirmish to save Sacco and Vanzetti from the electric chair. Judge George A. Anderson in state supreme court, refused to grant a writ of habeas corpus, and refused to issue a writ of error.

TROOPERS WILL GUARD COURT FOR HEARING

DEDHAM, Mass., Aug. 8.—State troopers, state detectives and Dedham police, threw an armed cordon around Norfolk county superior court today as Judge Webster Thayer after this afternoon came here to pass on the question of a revocation of sentence and a motion for new trial for Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti.

WOMEN WIN CONTEST IN BIBLE CLASS

Attendance at the First Presbyterian Sunday school broke all previous records Sunday when there were 337 persons present, marking the end of an attendance contest which has been waged between the women's and men's classes during the summer. The women won the contest on points, although Sunday they had 87 present as compared with 114 in the men's class.

Will Seek Appeals In Leboeuf Trial

FRANKLIN, La., Aug. 8.—Preparations were under way today for appeals in the cases of Mrs. Ada Bonner Leboeuf and Dr. Thomas E. Dreher, alleged lovers, convicted on charges of first degree murder of the woman's husband, James Leboeuf, by a circuit jury here late Saturday night. Mrs. Leboeuf, the first woman in Louisiana to be found guilty of first degree murder without recommendation for clemency, was disconsolate today.

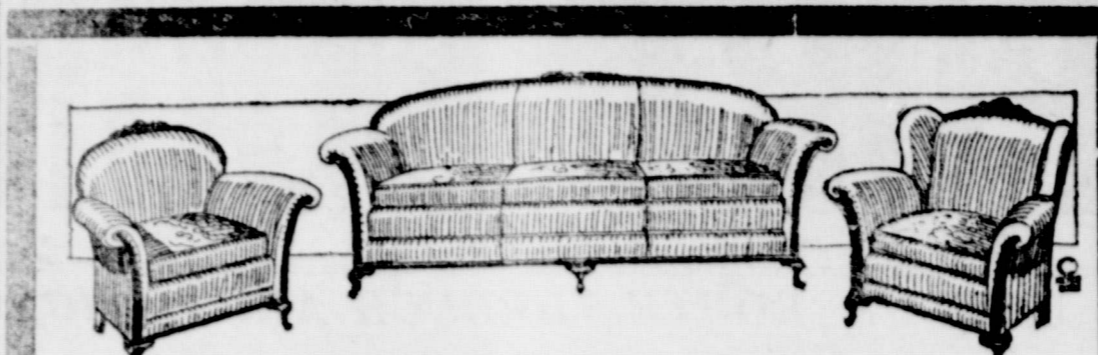

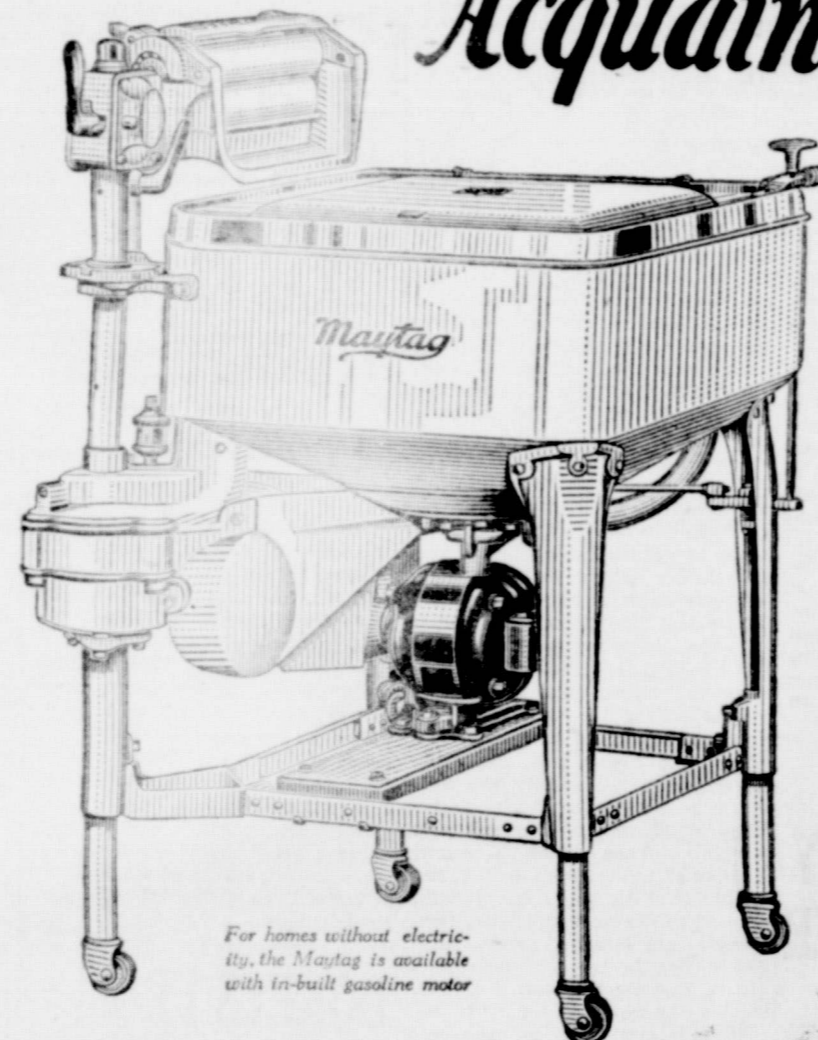


