

Wild Buying Marks First Estimate Of Year Which Shows Yield Will Be Much Smaller This Year Than Last

NEW YORK, Aug. 8 .- Following announcement of the first cot ton report of the season by the crop reporting board of the United States department of agriculture which indicated this year's crop would fall one million bales less than that of last year, a wild buying movement began today. Prices climbed steadily 200 points higher than the low of the morning. The situation became tense in the afternoon. Buying orders continued to flood the market, while no one showed any inclination to sell at trading limits. Trading consequently came to a halt, and prices swung to the best levels of the day. October closed the day at 18.95, bid up 180 points; December 19.22, bid, up 179; January 19.31, bid, up 186; March 19.50, bid, up 185. May 19.68, bid, up 185; and July 19.85, bid, up 199. Spot cotton was 230 points higher, midling uplands 19.45.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.-The United States cotton crop this year will be approximately 13,492,000 bales of 500 pounds grade weight, based upon a condition of 69 per cent of normal on August 1, the erop reporting board of the U. 
UNEARTHLY RADIO

In the air or in the earth? This is no mortal business, no, nor no sound that the earth owes." Not even a jazz orchestra or a political speech can quite dispel the mystery and charm of radio.
