EMOTIONS AND WRONG THINKING

One of the most tragic features of this very un happy Sacco-Vanzetti business is that the appeal t unreasoning emotion has become so widespread. Hundreds of people who have no possible way of finding out for themselves whether the men are guilty or innocent have nevertheless taken sides in the matter. Without even reading all that has been published concerning the case they have arrived at an emotional decision for or against these men. On the other hand are men and women who declare that the sooner the two are executed the better, and may all similar persons meet a like fate! On the other hand are the misguided people who believe that strikes and bombings and violence of all sorts can right a wrong. Wholesale killing would not bring Sacco and Vanzetti to life again after execution. Wholesale killing cannot even prove their innocence. It would not insure other accused men fair trials, if public opinion and the courts of law did not already do that. Whatever the outcome of this specific case, it has been a blot on the page of American justice because it has precipitated so much wrong thinking and wrong acting.

HIGHWAY BODY TO KEEP FUND DETAILS

AUSTIN, Aug. 17 .- "Every dime" spent by the State Highway department after Sept. 1 will be ac counted for and listed separately charged to its proper fund. Com missioner Cone Johnson said today. He said the new system of aud iting, which includes eight high speed tabulating machines capable of subtraction, addition, multiplication, division, listing and sorting, will eliminate all "leaks" and will keep a minute record, available at all times on a minute's notice of every phase of highway expenditure.

The department, Johnson added, has a balance of about \$5,000,000 despite its numerous heavy expenditures and at all times will kee "good balance."




