Rear Admiral Magruder, writing on naval economy in the Saturday Evening Post, makes these criticisms of the United States navy as it stands today. That it is greatly over-organized;

That demobilization since the war has not gone

That thriftless methods, possibly inevitable during the war, are still used;

That superfluous navy yards and stations are kept up, at great expense;

That ships useless for war purposes are kept in

These are questions for experts to determine. It is a serious thing when they are raised by a naval officer of Admiral Magruder's knowledge and position. Nobody, in public life or private life, wants to spend a lot of money on the navy without getting anything for it. The United States wants naval restriction. Possibly here is an opportunity for some thrifty disarmament that can be attended to without an international conference.

### **CARS IN 1935**

One car to every 2.8 persons in 1935 is the prediction of the United States bureau of public roads, in its transport survey of Ohio. There is one car to every 4.7 persons in Ohio right now. 
