WASHINGTON, Oct. 20 .-Albert B. Fall, former secre-tary of the interior, standing tary of the interior, standing trial with Harry F. Sinclair for criminal conspiracy, unexpectedly took the defense in his own hand for a few minutes today. Tired of several hours of wrangling over technicalities, the white-haired defendant areas and expressed fendant arose and expressed his own views to the court. Hoover was trying to get Finney to inter-pret two acts of congress which permitted leasing of the naval reserves. ### STEPHENS CO. **COURTHOUSE** HAS DEFECTS

BRECKENRIDGE, Oct. 20.-The Stephens county grand jury, reporting to Judge C. O. Hamlin, has recommended that a thorough investigation be made by a competent architect to determine the extent of alleged defects in the new, Stephens county courthouse. According to the grand jury report. many defects have been discovered in the half-million dollar building and in the mechanical work and in the materials used. The grand jury urged that the original plans and specifications be checked with the completed building to see, as far as possible, wherein the building is deficient.

Alleged bond irregularities in the county were also pointed out, it being alleged that in one instance \$40,00 which could have been realized out of the sale of certain bonds "was paid out in violation of law." The report also recommends that approximately \$1,000, 000 held in the county depository be used in retiring outstanding



Obviously, the only sound policy that will meet these obligations is to continue to furnish the best possible telephone service at the lowest cost conphone service at the lowest cost con-listent with financial safety. This pol-icy is bound to succeed in the long run and there is no justification for run and there is no justification for acting otherwise than for the long run.

"It follows that there is not only no incentive but it would be contrary to sound policy for the management to earn speculative or large profits for distribution as "melons" or extra dividends. On the other hand, payments to stockholders limited to reasonable regular dividends with their right, as the business requires new money from

time to time, to make further investments on favorable terms, are to the
interest both of the telephone users
and of the stockholders.

"Undoubtedly a very great factor






