# MYSTERY OF "GROWING" ROCKS EXPLAINED BY FREEZING

Numerous inquiries are received by the geological survey from various parts of the country, asking for explanation concerning the apparent tendency of rocks to "grow" a pult "sted and other fields, says Popular Mechanics Magazine. 
