





SELF-DEFENSE

Judge Florence E. Allen of the Ohio supreme court, who is devoting much of her time and energy to the cause of peace, advocates particularly the outlawing of war. Yet she recognizes that the civilized nations are not yet ready to give up the right of selfdefense. Addressing an audience the other day, she remarked: "Nine-tenths or more of the people who want world peace don't want to sacrifice the right of self-defense. I den't think we could abolish the right of self-defense if we tried to. It is an inherent right of nations and of individuals. The law justifies it, common sense dictates it. Wars don't begin in selfdefense, anyway. All wars begin in aggression. We will spend our treasure and shed our blood to defend ourselves, but we won't send our boys to shed their blood in another nation's quarrel." There is a discouraging feature in this point of view. TRUCULENT ARGENTINA

Our former friend Argentina seems to "have a mad on." She ran amuck at Havana, and is doing the same now at Geneva. The Monroe doctrine is a red ag to Argentina—as indeed it is to some of the other atin-American states, though they are usually courteous enough not to say much about it in public. Argentina objects to the League of Nations sanctioning this historic American policy in Article 21 of the League Covenant, which says: "Nothing in the covenant shall be deemed to affect the validity of international engagements such as treaties of arbitration or regional understandings like the Monroe Doctrine." Argentine insists that the doctrine is not a genuine 'regional engagement" or "regional understanding" at all, but merely a declaration by one party, to which the other parties-or Latin-America-have never agreed. This fight may continue until the United States is driven to conciliate the Latins of our hemisphere by expanding the present dictatorial doctrine into a Pan-American Doctrine, supported and enforced jointly by all the nations concerned.
