

It would be better if boys and girls did not have to go to work at gainful employment before their physical development is assured and their schooling completed. As long as they do, however, it is important that their health should be safeguarded as much as possible and that they themselves should be taught to keep well and fit.

In the first three months of last year, before Lindbergh's flight to France, our aircraft exports to that country amounted to \$234,000.
