Yet they may be a factor to reckon with in Oklahoma, Arizona and New Mexico. One of the vice presidential candidates has an advantage with them because of his Indian blood. Chief Buffalo Child Long Lance of the Blackfoot tribe makes an appeal for him on the ground that "He has slept in a wigwam, he has eaten of the buffalo, he has seen tribes on the warpath and has sat in their council." The situation is complicated, however, by the fact that both of the presidential candidates have been formally adopted into Indian tribes. As for the Indian's right to suffrage, Chief Buffalo seems to clinch that, and give the paleface voter something to think about, when he says: The Indians deserve to aid in the councils of the rovernment, for they had established a democracy on his soil long before the white man came. The great froquois confederation was so perfectly formed that their constitution was largely adopted in framing the one under which the country exists today."

THE PEDESTRIAN'S MOMENT.

Boston authorities have devised a new traffic light which will be a boon to pedestrians who feel that their rights are limited and their safety menaced when, although obeying signals, they find themselves still in the path of vehteles making permitted right or FUL SCREEN PRODUCTIONS OF left turns. This traffic signal has the usual red, amber and green lights. Their use and interpretation are normal enough, except for the fact that there is an interval in their shifting when the red and amber are flashed at the same time. This means that all venieular traffic in all directions must stop. At that thrilling moment pedestrians are free to cross the streets without any anxiety.
