DEADLY DISCOURTEOUS DRIVERS

Cincinnati ranks foremost among the cities showing a high percentage of automobile casualties.

"And for the life of me I can't see why," puzzled a leading official of Cincinnati in discussing the matter with a visitor.

"I can tell you why," snapped out the visitor. "The automobile drivers of Cincinnati are the most discourteous I have ever met anywhere!"

There is food for thought in that visitor's observation. What connection is there between discourmotorist play in motor car accidents?

When you stop to think of it, isn't it reasonable to assume that lack of manners is responsible in no small degree for Cincinnati's-and every other city's sued in this leap year. The girls must be looking be--large number of automotive disasters?

Discourtesy is a disregard of the other fellow, of on the leap. his rights and of his feelings. When an autoist is of a mind to disregard the rights and feelings of the others fellow, it is but a twist of the wrist to maining or killing him.

Indifference to others may be merely annoying in the drawing room, or on the sidewalk, or in the business office, or on the Pullman; but it is downright dangerous in traffic. It is devilishly destructive on,

We are inclined to believe that the unmannerly driver is-in substantial measure-the answer to the staggering total of automobile tragedies throughout the United States.

Kindly, thoughtful men and women behind feering wheels have in mind safeguarding the lives and limbs of their fellow citizens. When they drive they are not obsessed with the single thought of getting somewhere regardless. They have in mind as they go along, "I must be fair to those I meet or pass." I shall not even offend them, much less maim or kill them," The person who backs out without looking behind, the roadhog, the driver who stops his car between the lines at crossings, the motorist who doesn't cars, and who cuts in and out of traffic recklessly darts ahead of another machine when he should wai for an approaching car, who never observes traffic rules except to keep from paying a fine or going to jail, he is the deadly discourteous driver.

Perhaps more than traffic laws we need education in good manners; education in being decent and kind and thoughtful. If every person behind a steering wheel would start in being decent, kind and thoughtful today, automobile accidents would decline seventy-five to ninety per cent by tonight.

This he found difficult to explain. It wasn't heat so much as a peculiar feel that informed him.
