CONSERVING BANKS.

Bank failures during 1928 were only about half as numerous as they were during the years previous, according to the American Bankers association. The report of the state bank division of this association has estimated that the decline in the failure of state banking institutions was at least 42 per cent, whereas it was found that the decline in national bank failures was exactly 50 per cent. This reduction of the risks of banking by approximately one-half within a period of twelve months bespeaks a considerable improvement in bank management, inspection and to keep them at home.

The liquidation of a bank does not necessarily mean a loss to depositors, as the laws go erning that subject are so drastic as to give ample protection to a bank's customers. A bank is generally liquidated long before it threatens to become a loss to many persons; therefore, this record of bank failures must be accepted for exactly what it means, which is, a better method of bank management and a more stable economic condition generally throughout the country, that in turn protects the loans extended by

That the record of failures declined rather generally throughout the whole United States indicates further that there has been a rather broad disseminaion of improved banking technique and fairly stable economic conditions. The record in some localities was apparently much better than in others. It was stated, for instance, that in the District of Columbia, as well as in 13 states, namely, Alabama, Arizona, Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Massachusetts, Neyada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, Rhode Island, Vermont and Washington, there was no state bank failure during 1928.

During the last year or so, it may be noted, there has developed a tendency toward mergers in banks. In many states, banks are now allowed to maintain branches in the headquarters city, and in some instances a bank may operate branches throughout the state. The tendency toward branch banking, which has by this time attained considerable proportions, is probably responsible in part for the decline in bank failures. It is obvious that through a system of branch banking the assets of a branch may be protected and assured with more ease than if the branch is maintained as a distinct and independent banking unit. And by the same token that which tends to reduce the number of bank liquidations operates in the same way to conserve banking facilities.

AMERICAN PLAYS IN PARIS.

It is said that French dramatists are much alarm-remedy. The special committee in charge of the investigation admits, a bit naively, that it is a difficult matter because so many French plays are produced broad. A disinterested party might ask the French dramatists why they worry so long as their plays are produced somewhere with success. During the first session 14,143 bills were introduced and during the short session 3,130 have been introduced. In addition to the bills 342 house resolutions, 429 joint resolutions and 59 concurrent resolutions have been introduced. Making new laws appear to be the most successful of American industries, exclusive of oil and steel.
