OIL MAN IS **COMPOSED AS** TERM BEGINS

Greeting to Fellow Inmates Friendly but Restrained.

WASHINGTON, May 7. - Harry Sinclair, dominant figure in the world, arose from a hard cot today to serve the first day of a three-month sentence in district jail for contempt of the senate.

The multi-millionaire wore the expensive blue suit he had on when he arrived at the jail last night. He had discarded his white shirt for a colored one. A dark four-inhand tie and a light blue hand-kerchief protrucking from the breast pocket of his coat completed his ensemble.

Sinclair issued a friendly but restrained greeting to fellow prisoners in the dormitory and walked = hurriedly to the mess hall where he sat at a long wooden table and he sat at a long wooden table and read two Washington newspapers while munching toast and drinking while munching toast and drinkig black coffee. He passed up a cereal, ham and eggs, French fried potatoes and corn muffins.
