### **Ex-students to meet February 15**



### St. Teresa's Mexican Dinner





> We have recently received nice donations of children's books and cookbooks, including several community cookbooks.


> We welcome book donations, which need to be taken to the Friona Public Library. At this time we would especially appreciate donations of western novels, biographies, or historical fiction.


> We are working on further categorizing our three main groups of books: fiction, non-fiction, and youth/children's books.

Principal Ben Kirton and Connie Slagle have been very helpful and supportive in getting this project started.


BBBS currently serves 115 children in Hereford and have been serving children in Hereford for 41 years. The program in Friona is being partially funded by United Way of Friona.
