about which made for amusing and provocative reading. Because of these odditities, early
editions have become colle

In fact there were so many

lish Bibles that all printing of lish Bibses that all printing of
the King James Bible finally
came under control of the Britcame under control of the Brit
ish crown Only especially H -
censed printers were allowed censed printers were allowe to print the scriptures.
In 1702 , another misprin

misprinted scriptures--where misprinted scriptures--where
King Davils says "Printers (in-
