Shepherds tending their sheep in the fields nearby also found their way to the stable. A messenger had appeared, saying that a king would be born in humble surroundings this night.

And so a king was born. The King of Peace. The King of Hope. He was born as a child of Mary, who had come to Bethehem with Joseph the Carpenter. The law decred that all ditizens annually vist hhat native aty so s tax count might be onducted by Roman
authorities. Because they were of the family of David, they had made a long journey from Nazareth

In the only shelter available, the stables at the rear of the crowded inn, the child was born - Jesus Christ. In official record he was the son of Joseph the Cappenter and his wife, Mary. Of mild

Mary was a virgin mother and that the birth of the child was something of a miracle, the fulfillment of a long-written prophesy that the lineage of David would bring forth a king and a saviour of the people.
