Teachers recommended 12 students and the program go underway. Parents of the recommended students must sign papers agreeing on the arrangement.
Mentors meet once a week with the student at noon and work on then the mentor may choose something else to
work, When the student completes seven assignments, he receive a gift. The organization also gives each one a gift at the end of school and at Christmas.
"I like to do fun science things if we have extra time," she said. "These kiddos need a grandma or grandpa. A little extra attention."
The Bigs program is operated through the Big Brothers Big Sisters office in Hereford. Mrs. Slagle also is in charge of the Friends of the Library
