In the United States, someone has a heart attack every 34 seconds. Each minute, someone in the United States dies from a heart disease related event. High blood pressure, high LDL (bad) cholesterol, and smoking are key heart disease risk factors. Several other medical conditions and lifestyle choices can also put people at a higher risk for heart disease including diabetes, overweight and obesity, poor diet, physical inactivity, and excessive alcohol use.
