## Cast iron stoves hot items

PORTLAND, Maine (AP) — One man's blizzard is another man's ski weekend.

Or: "If there be justice in the land, this harshest winter since the glaciers receded ought also to be expected to deliver at least some consolation prize to somebody somewhere, and it has."

John Pozorycki's foundry founders no longer. In fact it is going full tilt, turning out old-fashioned cast iron wood burning stoves like they were, um, going out of style. Forget the recession, this foundry hasn't known such prosperity since the Great Depression. Something to think about.

"I'm sure the energy crisis and the hard winter have much to do with it," John Pozorycki said. "But even before the oil shortage our orders were up. People seem

to be returning to things of proven substance and value, and there's something solid and comforting about a good wood stove."

There also is something solid and comforting, if not ironic, about a century-old stove foundry, using methods and patterns unchanged over the years, struggling to keep up with demand for a product considered obsolete two decades ago.

When it comes to cast iron wood stoves, John Pozorycki is an incurable romantic. The bustle rattling at the old handwren rafters at the Portland Stove Foundry was not really what he expected when he took over the company two years ago.

"I was just looking for some place to go in Maine," he said. "I was 60. The children were grown and

married, and I had had enough of traveling all over the place as a consulting engineer."

"Something I always remembered away from home was the old wood stove in the house where I grew up in Maynard, Mass. I remembered the warmth of the kitchen."

"When I had a chance to buy into this foundry, I grabbed it."

The foundry, for its first 93 years, had been the property of three generations of a family named Lawrence. Then it fell on hard times — coal, gas, electricity for heating — and went through a succession of owners until Pozorycki took over.

The foundry turns out Franklin stoves, parlor stoves, box stoves ("We called them schoolhouse stoves when I was a boy"),

each part fashioned from molds made from honest sand shipped from Albany, N.Y., just as the original Lawrence fashioned them 100 years ago.

And somewhere in a woebegone shed, the pattern room, a room kept locked, are the 150 patterns for the foundry's original pride and joy, the Queen Atlantic range.

In 1909, by company records, the Queen fetched \$65, five down and a dollar a week. Today it will go for something over \$1,200.

"We're going to make the Queen again in quantity," John Pozorycki said. "I don't believe you could duplicate those patterns today, all that scrollwork and the cherubs and the decorations. Pattern makers just don't seem to have that artistry anymore."

Will artistry and craftsmanship, in the end, win out after all?

Will grandma's Queen Atlantic kitchen range become the dependable successor to the microwave oven?

Hang in there, John Pozorycki.

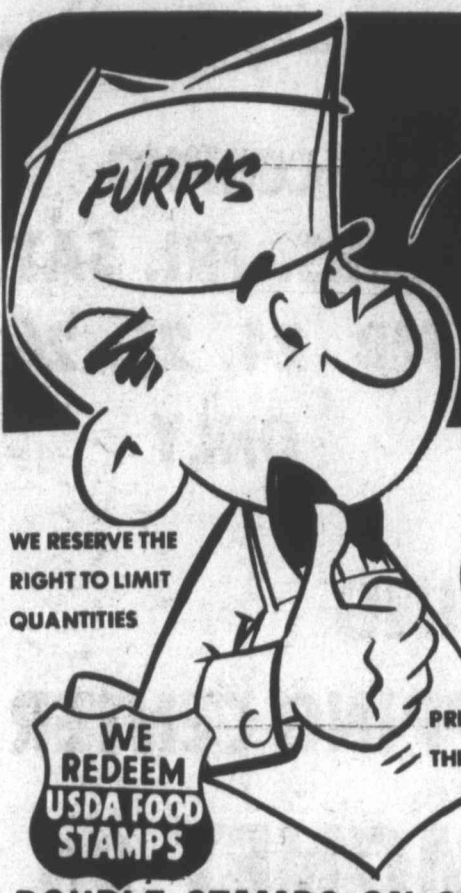

### Van Buren liked big bathtub

KINDERHOOK, N.Y. (AP) — Martin Van Buren, the nation's eighth president, was known as "The Little Magician" in part because of his short stature. But he apparently liked a big bathtub.

The tub is one of the discoveries about Van Buren made as National Park Service historians restore Lindenwald, the estate where he lived for 23 years.

Van Buren stood five feet, six inches, but the tub is six feet long and 25 inches wide. It was found beneath a collapsed barn behind the 36-room mansion.

Van Buren succeeded Jackson as president, serving from 1837 until 1841.

## Energy Gas shortages in spotlight

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congressional investigators call it withholding gas. Oil company executives refer to it as deferring development of their reserves.

But Rep. John E. Moss says its name doesn't matter "to the nearly half-million Americans who have been or are still unemployed because of gas curtailments in this severest of winters."

The California Democrat chairs a House Commerce subcommittee which on Wednesday completed a round of hearings on gas supply problems.

Moss and committee investigators claim there has been deliberate withholding by producers on federal oil and gas leases in the Gulf of Mexico. They say oil com-

panies are sitting on their reserves to await higher prices or for other economic reasons.

An Interior Department study released last week also found that production in some Gulf of Mexico fields had been drastically reduced over the past few years — for no apparent reason. That study stopped short of using the term "withholding."

Yet despite the congressional hearings and the Interior report, the central issue of whether gas is being intentionally kept off the interstate market remains unresolved.

In a news conference on Wednesday, President Carter said, "I think it is obvious to all of us that there are some instances where

natural gas is withheld from the market. That's understandable. If I was running an oil company I would reserve the right to release or to reserve some supplies of natural gas."

During his campaign, Carter called for lifting federal price controls from gas in interstate commerce for a trial period of four to five years. Some form of this proposal may be in the energy bill he submits to Congress in late April.

Investigators for Moss' subcommittee said that Texaco has reserves of over 500 billion cubic feet of natural gas in two non-producing reservoirs off the Louisiana coast that it could have pumped into interstate pipelines on six months' notice.

The investigators said this gas could have helped ease the winter's gas crisis, but that Texaco is withholding it from production to maximize its profits by awaiting higher prices.

The allegation was disputed Wednesday by Texaco Senior Vice President Richard B. Palmer. He acknowledged the gas was there but said its production was reserved for the future.

"Some critics claim new wells should be drilled to produce known reserves still faster at all costs. This could have a disastrous result," Palmer warned. "Interstate pipeline companies have designed their systems based on a continued supply for at least 15 to 20 years."

Moss said he was unimpressed by Texaco's explanation or similar

statements by other oil company executives. He claimed it was "an exercise in rhetorical niceties which avoids the really central issue at hand: who should control the rate of development of natural gas from publicly owned lands?"

Moss' subcommittee also released a separate report Wednesday accusing Gulf Oil Corp. of failing to deliver contracted natural gas to a pipeline system serving 16 states while selling gas at higher prices to other buyers.

The report said Gulf violated federal law in renegeing on its contract to supply 625 million cubic feet of gas per day to the Texas Eastern Transmission Corp. The report also accused the Federal Power Commission of failing for six years to take action against Gulf.

## Carter proposes new energy agency

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Carter's proposed new Cabinet-level Department of Energy would consolidate under one roof energy programs now run by 19 separate agencies, administration and congressional sources say.

The legislation, which Carter said he will submit to Congress early next week, would dismantle the Federal Energy Administration and the Energy Research and Development Administration and transfer all their functions to the new department.

It would also place in the new agency some programs now in the Interior Department and scattered over numerous other federal agencies and departments, the sources said.

In his televised news conference Wednesday, Carter also said he probably will appear before a joint session of Congress to present his comprehensive energy policy around April 20.

He said the policy will be "quite profound in its impact on the American consciousness and our society."

The new department is likely to win approval in Congress, where efforts have been underway for several years to consolidate energy agencies. However, some of the details of the plan — such as what to do with the leasing programs now administered by the Interior Department — could generate controversy.

## Oil leaking from tanker

HONOLULU (AP) — A below-waterline crack in the hull of a Liberian tanker carrying 28 million gallons of crude oil has leaked an undetermined amount of the oil into the Pacific about 330 miles west of here, the U.S. Coast Guard reported.

The 840-foot Hawaiian Patriot radioed a circling Coast Guard C130 aircraft Wednesday night that it was not in any immediate danger of sinking.

The 12-year-old tanker earlier sent a distress call, reporting it was making "very slow" headway in stormy weather, said Coast Guard spokesman Jim Gilman.

The Coast Guard aircraft remained in the area and a Coast Guard cutter was dispatched from Honolulu.

The ship, which has a crew of 48, is owned by Indopacific Carriers of Monrovia, Liberia. It was enroute from Indonesia to Hawaii.

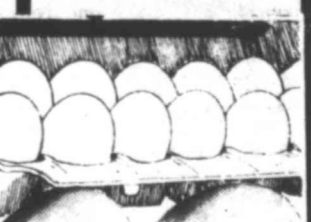
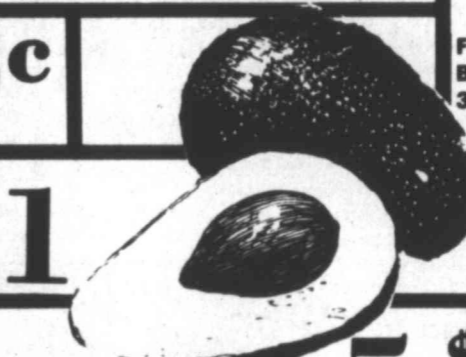
