## New law establishes definition, rules for autocycles

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) is informing Texans about a new motor vehicle designation created by the 84th Texas Legislature through SB 449, which defines an autocycle and establishes requirements for titling, registration and operation. The law went into effect May 22,

An autocycle constitutes a motor vehicle, other than a tractor, that is: designed to have when propelled not more than three wheels on the ground; equipped with a steering wheel; equipped with seating that does not require the operator to straddle or sit astride the seat; and manufactured and certified to comply with federal safety requirements for a motorcycle.

The bill also specifies an autocycle is required to be titled and registered as a motorcycle. Additionally, an autocycle can be operated under a Class C driver license (the standard license for operating a motor vehicle).

# Recipes for celebrating Dairy Month in style

It is recommended that people 9-years and older consume 3 servings of low-fat or fat-free dairy every day. However, on average people are consuming only about 2 servings of dairy a day.

## Cheddar and Mushroom Breakfast Squares

Makes 9 servings Prep time: 20 min. Cook time: 60 min.

#### Ingredients:

2 tsp. butter

2 cups sliced white button mushrooms

½ cup sliced green onion, including green tops

6 slices country-style whole-grain bread, cubed

2 cups shredded, reduced-fat Cheddar cheese 2 cups fat-free or low-fat milk

2 cups egg substitute

1 tsp. red or green hot pepper sauce

Instructions:

Spray an 8 x 8-inch square glass or ceramic baking dish with cooking spray; set aside.

In a medium skillet over medium heat, melt butter and add mushrooms. Cook mushrooms about 5 minutes or until softened and brown
at edges. Stir in green onion; set aside. Place ½ of the bread cubes in
prepared baking dish. Scatter ½ of the mushroom mixture and ½ of the
cheese over bread cubes. Layer remaining bread cubes and mushroom
mixture; set aside.

In a large bowl, beat milk, egg substitute and pepper sauce until well blended. Pour milk mixture over bread cubes and top with the remaining cheese.

Make ahead suggestion: cover dish with foil and refrigerate for 8-10 2 ½ cups) hours before baking.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Bake, covered for 45 minutes. Remove foil and bake an additional 15 minutes or until top is puffed up and cheese is browned at edges. Let cool for 5 minutes; cut into squares to serve. Note: Create your own variations by using other vegetables.

## Baked Spinach Artichoke Yogurt Dip

Makes 8 servings Prep time: 10 min.

Cook time: 20 min.

#### Ingredients:

1 (14-ounce) can artichoke hearts, drained and chopped Storage tip: Squares 1 (10-ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed and zen for single servings.

drained
1 (8-ounce) container low-fat plain yogurt

1 cup shredded part-skim, low-moisture mozzarella cheese 1/4 cup chopped green onion

1 garlic clove, minced

2 tablespoons chopped red pepper

#### Instructions:

Combine all ingredients except red pepper and mix well.

Pour mixture into 1-quart casserole dish or 9-inch pie plate.

Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 20-25 minutes, or until heated through, and sprinkle with red peppers. Serve with toasted whole-grain bread or crackers.

## **Cheesy Chicken Crunchers**

Makes 6 servings Prep time: 30 min. Cook time: 25 min.

#### Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour

4 egg whites

½ cup reduced-fat milk

or BBQ sauce, if desired.

1 ½ cups cornflakes

1 cup reduced-fat, shredded Cheddar cheese

6 chicken breast filets; cut into strips

#### Instructions:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees Fahrenheit. Set up three bowls with the following: 1) flour; 2) an egg-wash; made by beating the eggs and milk together; 3) cornflakes mixed with cheese.

Coat a 13 x 9-inch baking pan with non-stick cooking spray. Dip chicken pieces in flour, then into the egg-wash, then roll in the cheesy-flakes mixture, coating the entire piece of chicken, and place on the baking pan. Discard any unused cornflake mixture after coating chicken. Bake for 25 minutes, turning halfway through to ensure even browning. Serve with ketchup

## Strawberry Frozen Yogurt Squares

Makes 9 servings Prep time: 10 min. Freezer time: 8 hours

#### Ingredients:

1 cup crunchy wheat and barley cereal

3 cups fat-free strawberry yogurt

1 (10-ounce) bag frozen unsweetened strawberries (about 2 ½ cups)

1 cup fat-free sweetened condensed milk

1 cup light of fat-free whipped topping (optional)

#### Instructions:


Line an 8 x 8-inch baking pan with foil. Sprinkle cereal evenly on the bottom of the pan; set aside.

Place yogurt, strawberries and condensed milk in a blender; cover and blend until smooth. Pour the mixture to edges of pan. Cover with foil (or plastic wrap) and freeze for 8 hours or until firm. 




