The council voted to revisit and restructure the ordinance agreement with Kendrick in order to maintain ownership of the city street. The second public hearing concerned a rezoning request on Maple Street to allow Kendrick to build two additional wash and lube bays with truck traffic exiting onto Maple, turning left to Highway 60. Home owners along Maple objected to the request, citing additional traffic and child safety issues.
