## Council will adopt budget, tax rate

The Friona city council will meet Monday September 12 at 6:30 p.m. All council meetings are open to the public.

To kick off the meeting the council will have public hearings regarding the proposed city budget and the proposed tax rate of \$0.7512 per \$100 valuation.

The council will then approve an ordinance adopting the budget for fiscal year beginning October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017. They will also consider and take action on the proposed tax

rate to fund the city government for the fiscal year. The Friona Economic Development Corporation fiscal year budget will be approved.

The council will consider and take action on an ordinance prohibiting drilling or mining within the city park area of the City of Friona and providing for a penalty for violating this ordinance and declaring that an emergency exists.

The Friona Police Department will give the monthly report. Accounts receivable and financial statements for

August 2016 will be discussed and approved.

Action will be taken to close city hall September 30, 2016 for yearend procedures. A carport variance requested by Victor Gradada at 1608 James St. will be considered. Action will be taken to award a bid for re-roofing at the Friona Fire Department.

This is a tentative agenda and subject to change. The official agenda is posted on the front window at city hall at least 72 hours prior to the meeting.

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor,

Well, it seems that there is a crispness in the air and we will all recognize this to mean our weather is changing and Fall is coming soon. Harvest time is upon us, and with it comes school busses full of children, busy highways filled with harvest equipment and hurried truck drivers trying to quickly make it back to the field before harvest equipment has to come to a grinding halt. This is one of my favorite times of the year, but it also carries the potential to be a very dangerous time.

As many of you know, there is an ongoing effort from concerned citizens in our area to bring attention to the Intersection of State Highways 214 and 86. There have been numerous deadly crashes there in the past and it seems a rash of accidents just this year alone. I live on Highway 214, and every time the electricity blinks or goes out

without a storm being present, I say a prayer and hope no one has been seriously hurt in another accident.

We hope you will join us in our efforts to help make TxDOT aware of our concerns and the need for added safety measures for this intersection. Rumble strips were added last month as you approach the intersection coming from both directions. While we thank TxDOT for this, more warnings of an approaching intersection are still needed. Possibly a reduced speed on both highways as you approach, and most definitely flashing lights of some kind.

We urge you to help by contacting TxDOT, and also our Parmer County State Representative, John T. Smithee to ask for their assistance. You may reach Mr. Smithee at: 320 South Polk, 1st Floor, Lobby Box 28, Amarillo TX. 79101. A petition is also being

circulated around the community, I signed it last Sunday at church, and it is being placed in other places of business in Friona. I want to thank Becky Riethmayer and Connie Slagle for their ongoing efforts to achieve these goals. If you need more information, they would be happy to assist you.

Finally I would like to say, please drive cautiously and be aware of other drivers and obstacles at all times, especially on this little strip of highway between Friona and Muleshoe. I dare say that with our increased commercial traffic and the fact that it is still only two lanes, the road is more dangerous than it has ever been. I have a lot of loved ones who travel this road every day, and I want to see them come home safely every night.

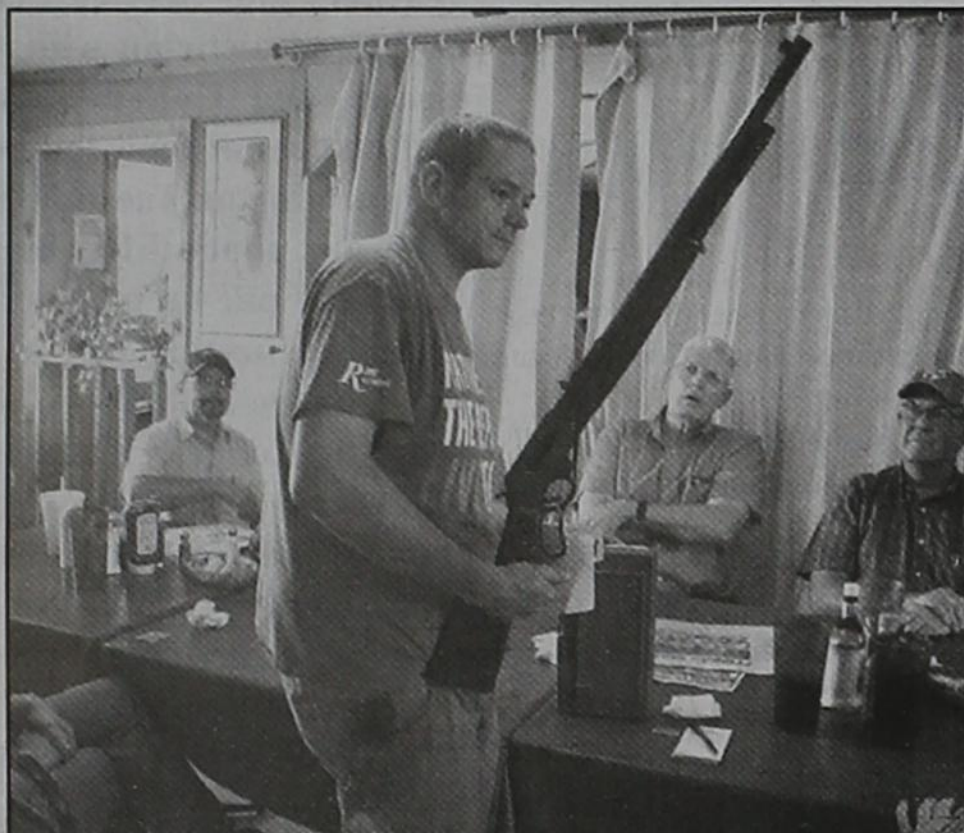

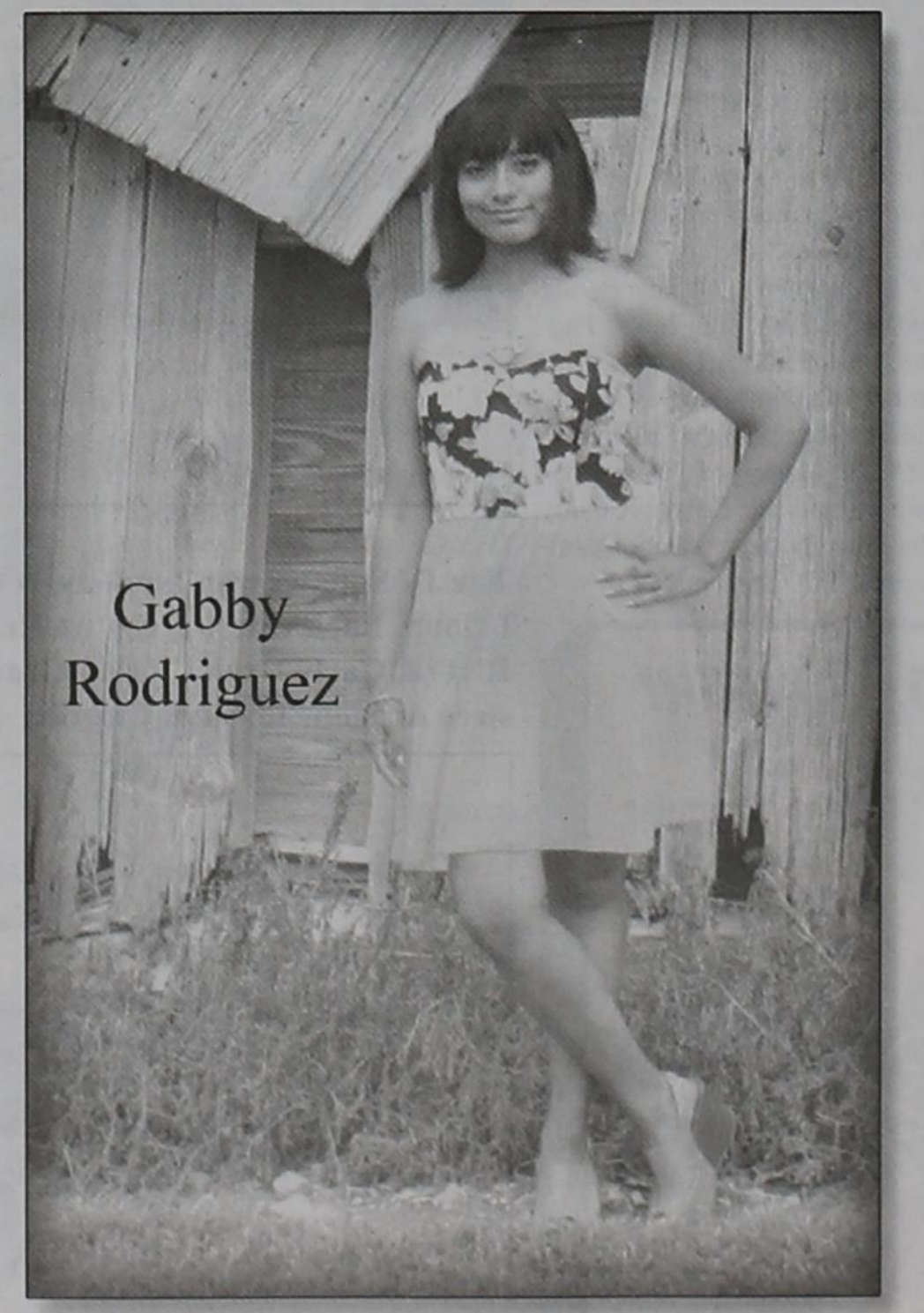

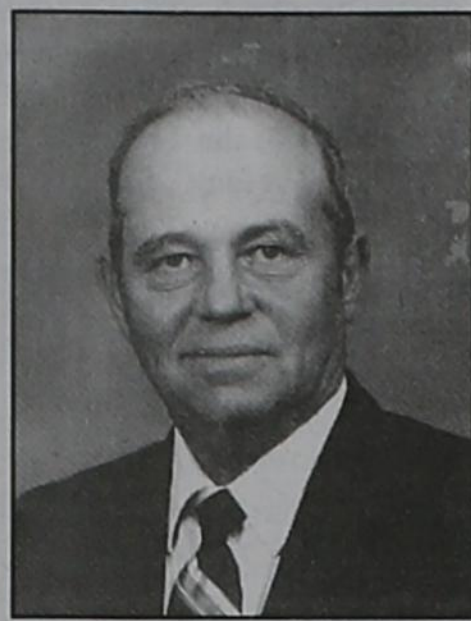
Steve didn't get upset; he learned he didn't always know what is best for someone. How many times have our pre-conceived ideas or expectations about someone been ours, and not God's?

**Facing Fear With Faith**  
**Part 3**

This past week we traveled to Fort Robinson, Nebraska to go camping and explore the rich history of the area, which included a trip to Mount Rushmore and the Crazy Horse Monument. I highly recommend the trip if you want an excellent get away rich with historical significance. We camped in a nice campground using our trusty 19'x10' tent. We had beautiful weather for most of the week. Thursday night, however the wind showed up and as the gales increased the little tent struggled to maintain shape.

As I lay there in the dark, watching every wall contort to the winds which I began to long for a more permanent structure. By midnight the winds were up to 40 plus mph with no sign of letting up. My prayers became more fervent. It seems when pressed on every side we tend to be more focused in prayer. By about 4 a.m. it began to get back down into the 20 mph range, which seemed much better than the previous 8 hours.

In the reflecting during those early hours, I began to appreciate with much clarity Paul's comments in 2 Cor. 5. He says this: "[1] For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. [2] For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling, [3] if indeed by putting it on we may not be found naked. [4] For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. [5] He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee." 2 Cor. 5:1-5 ESV

So face fear with a faith and understanding of reality. We are as frail as a tent, but God has given us His Spirit as a guarantee of a building from God. So although we long for something permanent let us also live with confidence that others may find the same confidence that we have in faith. Our strength comes not in our tent, but in the One who is willing to dwell within it with us.

**New AgriLife Research scientists take aim at Zika**

Today's news is flooded with reports on Zika; none of them good... until now.

Texas A&M AgriLife Research has fielded a Zika team led by two scientists who joined the department of entomology at Texas A&M University on Aug. 1, said Dr. David Ragsdale, department head at College Station.

Dr. Zach Adelman and Dr. Kevin Myles were previously at Virginia Tech and now join the ranks of a number of AgriLife Research personnel whose priority has become stopping Zika, he said.

"Dr. Adelman and Dr. Myles are longtime collaborators who have joined us here in College Station. Both men have earned world-renowned reputations for their work on viruses."

"Dr. Myles is working to understand the basic biology of how these viruses replicate in mosquitoes, while one of Dr. Adelman's projects involves creating mosquitoes that are resistant to viruses such as Zika."

The pair's work will take mosquito management where it has never been before, Ragsdale said.

"They will address the mosquito and disease relationship in ways not previously considered," he said. "Like all discovery science at the very edges

of what we know, the outcomes are uncertain, but the potential for development of technologies that revolutionize mosquito and disease management is very real."

Adelman said one of his primary goals is to develop new genetic technologies to help suppress or eliminate *Aedes aegypti* and *Aedes albopictus* mosquito populations locally, nationally and beyond.

"As vectors of dengue, yellow fever, chikungunya and now Zika, it is clear that as long as these mosquitoes are allowed to persist in close proximity to humans, the litany of viruses will only continue to grow, and with it the burden on public health," he said.

Myles said mosquito-borne diseases continue to cause unacceptable levels of loss in humans and domesticated animals and that globalization is increasingly blurring the traditional boundaries of these diseases.

"West Nile virus, first introduced in a 1999 outbreak in New York City, is now prevalent throughout the U.S.," Myles said. "A more recent example is the emergence of Zika virus in Micronesia and the South Pacific with subsequent spread to the Americas."

"Pathogens like these are transmit-

ted to humans when the virus is able to overcome the immune defenses of a mosquito vector. Thus, a primary focus of my laboratory is on understanding this process, with the goal of using this information to develop new genetic control strategies and novel vaccines."

Intense media attention has made Zika a household word to many Texans. The mosquito-transmitted Zika virus is a serious threat to the health of unborn babies. Women infected by the virus while pregnant are known to have babies with microcephaly, a condition where the fetal brain and head do not fully develop and reach normal size.

*A. aegypti* and *A. albopictus*, the mosquitoes capable of transmitting Zika, occur commonly in residential areas where they use even small amounts of standing water to reproduce, Ragsdale said. *Aedes* mosquitoes infected with Zika are hard to detect, so health officials will have to rely on actual human cases to identify hot spots once the virus arrives in native mosquito populations.

"We're now seeing media reports of confirmed Zika cases stemming from homegrown mosquitoes in Florida," he said. "There have been a number of cases reported in Texas, but those were related to foreign travel, so con-

firmation of Zika in native mosquito populations is a concern our scientists are urgently seeking to thwart."

Ragsdale noted that as of this writing, there have been no known cases of Zika stemming from native mosquito populations in Texas.

"This is an insidious virus because people can have it and never know it," Ragsdale said.

He said some travelers to Zika-infested countries are unknowingly coming home infected with the virus. When *Aedes* mosquitoes bite infected people, the insects acquire the virus. The mosquito then bites another person, transmitting the virus to that previously uninfected person.

"As it stands now, the best defense is to keep from getting bitten by mosquitoes both here and abroad, although that's a pretty tall order for most outdoor-loving Texans."

"Soon though, it is our hope the energy and knowledge these two researchers bring to our top team of AgriLife Research entomologists will result in scientific breakthroughs in ridding the country of the Zika virus and quite possibly other mosquito-borne diseases as well."

The 8th grade team opened up with a win over Littlefield, then defeated Dimmitt in the series but lost to a tough Texico team in the finals.

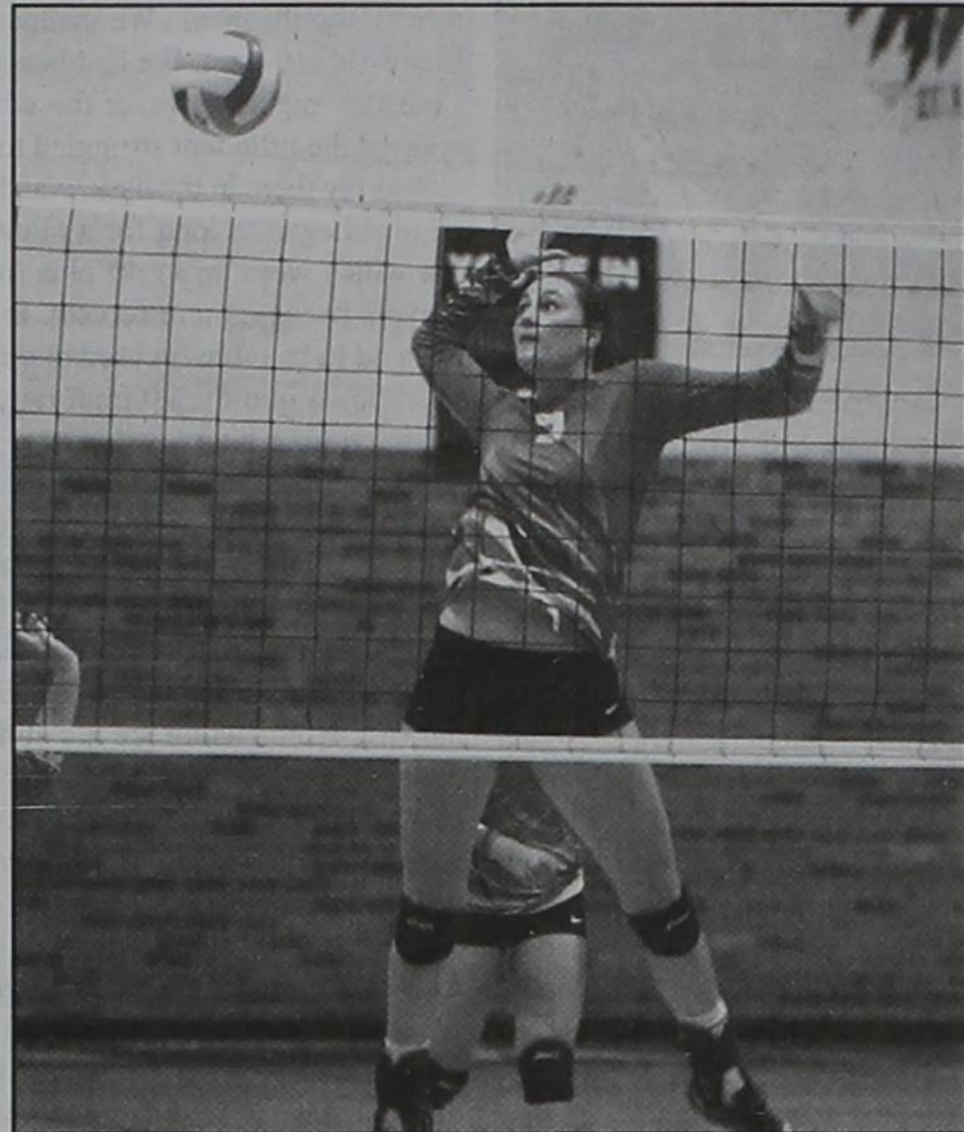

used consistent serving and passing to come out on top with a 25-16, 25-12, victory. The JV is 13-5 on the season.

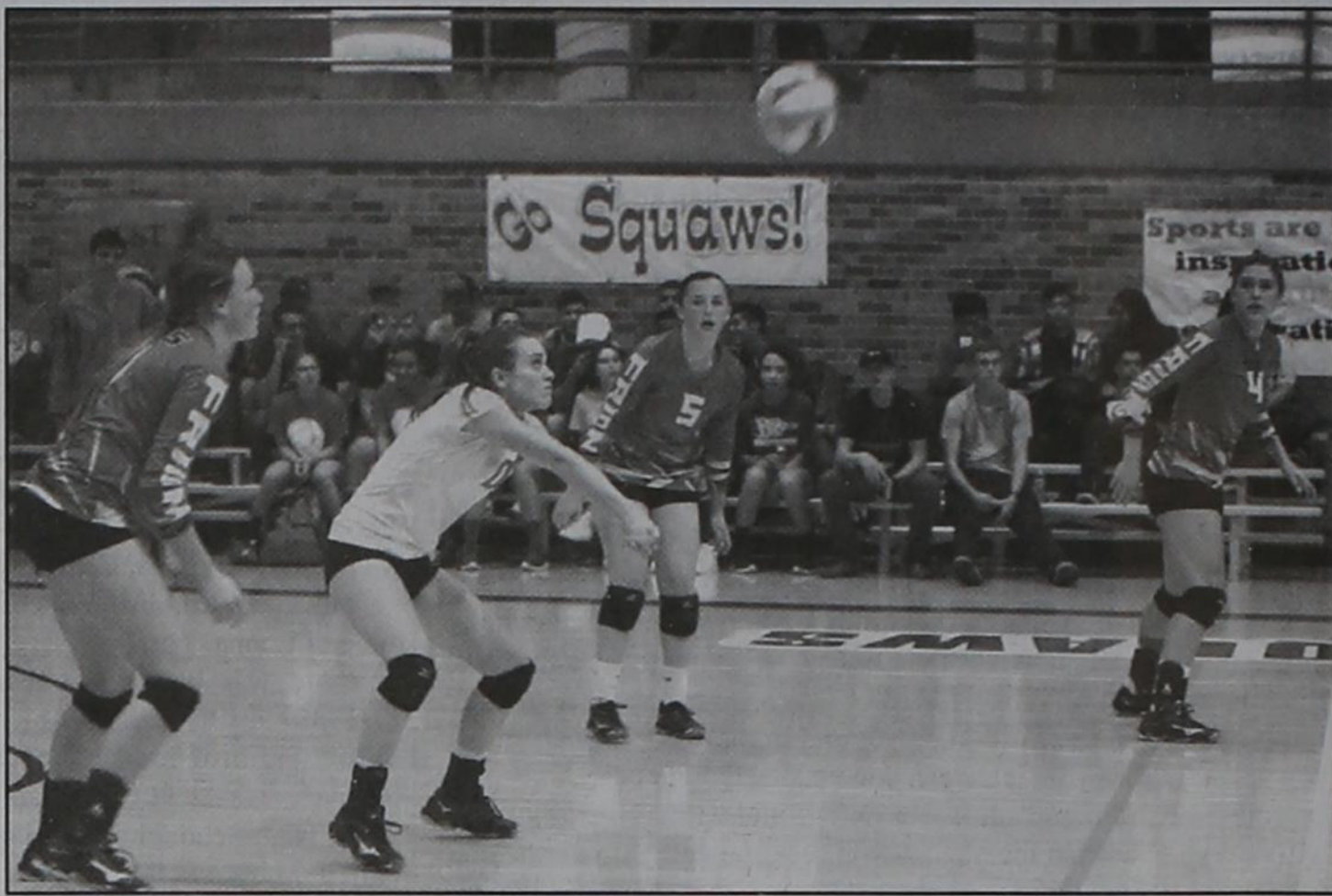
The varsity followed suit with a 3-0 set victory. After starting slow the ladies built

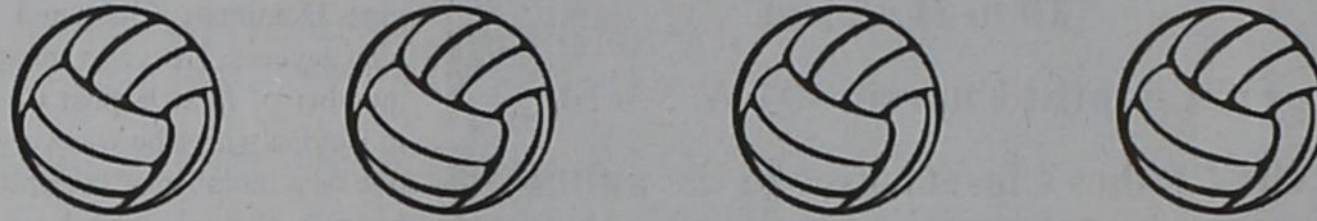

## HPWD Board cancels Nov. 8 election

At their September 13 board meeting, the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District (HPWD) will approve an order canceling the November 8, 2016 general election in District Directors' Precincts Three and Four.

Incumbents Mike Beauchamp of Friona and Lynn Tate of Amarillo were the only candidates to file an application for place on the ballot for Precinct Three District Director and Precinct Four District Director, respectively.

The candidate filing deadline was August 22 and the write-in candidate deadline was August 26.

Under the Texas Election Code, the water district may cancel an election if the candidates whose names are to appear on the ballot are unopposed; there are no declared write-in candidates; and there is no proposition to appear on the ballot.

The Election Code also provides that the unopposed candi-

dates be declared duly elected to their respective offices. This will be the second four-year term for both Beauchamp and Tate. They will receive their respective Oaths of Office at a Board meeting later in the year.

Precinct Three includes Bailey County, the portion of Castro County within the district, and Parmer County.

Precinct Four includes the portions of Armstrong, Deaf Smith, Potter, and Randall Counties within the district.

## Comptroller announces Eminent Domain Database

The Texas Comptroller's office launched a state-wide online eminent domain database. This publicly available tool will show which governmental and non-governmental entities have reported to the Comptroller their authority to exercise eminent domain.

"This is clearly an area in which transparency is absolutely essential," Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar said. "Knowing who can use eminent domain is the first step to ensuring that this potentially oppressive power is used wisely."

The database was created to comply with Senate Bill 1812, approved during the 2015 legislative session. The bill requires public and private entities with eminent domain authority to report certain information to the Comptroller's office.

The database contains 5,042 entities, including cities, counties, school districts, special purpose districts, pipeline and energy companies, water supply corporations, telecommunications companies and other public and private entities.

The database includes each entity's name and contact information and reported eminent domain information, including: the date upon which the entity claims to have been authorized to exercise eminent domain authority; whether the entity filed a condemnation petition in calendar 2015; the projects or purposes for which the entity holds eminent domain authority; and the provisions of the law granting that authority.
