No more Mammograms at HRMC

Hereford Regional Medical Center will no longer perform mammograms. Patients that have had a mammogram at HRMC can retrieve records through the Radiology Department. Radiology is open Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Patients will receive discs and reports of their mammogram. The Harrington Breast Center will be sending a mobile unit to HRMC once a month to accommodate HRMC patients. As the need for mammograms increase Harrington Breast Center will make more frequent visits to HRMC.

Commissioners lift burn ban

At their Monday May 16 meeting the Parmer County commissioners lifted the county burn ban until further notice.

A FEMA representative was at the meeting to discuss the county's request for reimbursement for the many hours spent on snow removal and road repair as a result of the December blizzard. County Judge Trey Ellis said about 800 hours were recorded for snow removal but FEMA has not allowed reimbursement of hours spent by private citizens. He said the FEMA rep would meet individually with county commissioners to determine whether any payment will be approved.

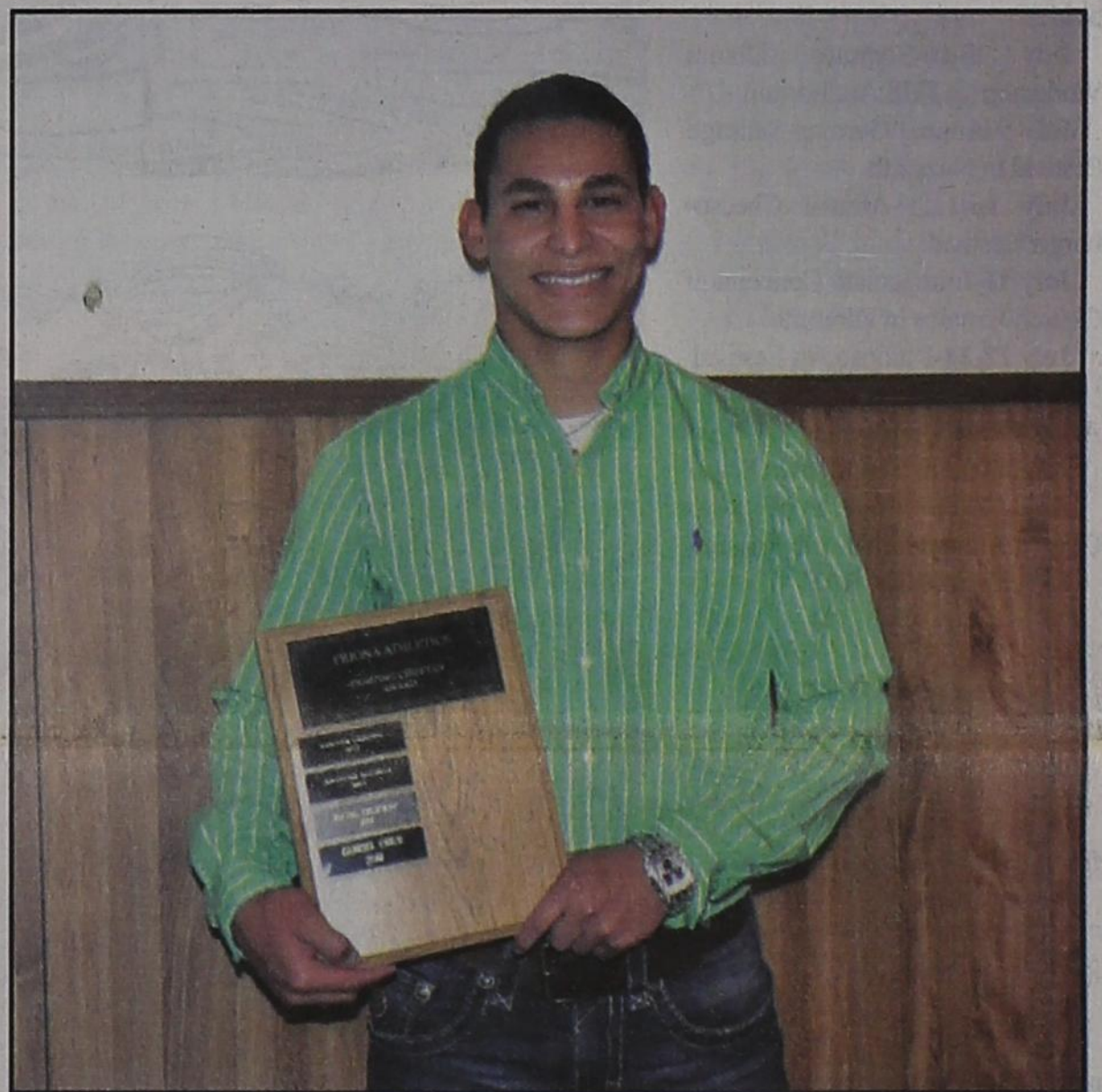
County auditor Larry Johnston's annual audit report was approved and County Treasurer Altha Herington gave her report.

Commissioners approved an agreement with Eddie Miller to trim trees away from the courthouse and the parking lots. An audio visual equipment upgrade for the District Courtroom was discussed and approved. Current equipment is outdated. New speakers, tape player, and screen are among the items approved.

They also approved some conservation work to be done in Precinct 2 which is the Bovina precinct. Sheriff Randy Geris said the county jail is no longer housing inmates from Hutchinson County. Their jail was upgraded and approved. Geris also said he is trading a 2007 Ford Expedition in the purchase of a new Chevy Tahoe for the Sheriff's Department. The new Tahoe is being purchased from Stevens 5-Star in Hereford.

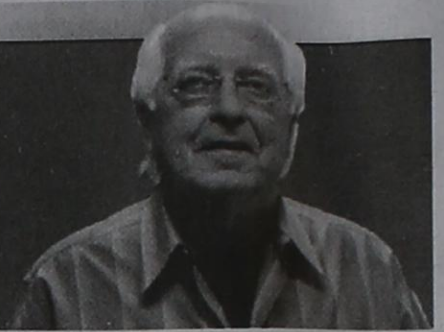

Chickens and such

A few years ago, I was asked to attend a meeting in Lubbock concerning the Lesser Prairie Chicken. My first question was, "What is a Lesser Prairie Chicken?"

This led to other questions:

"Is there a Higher Prairie Chicken?" "If the chicken is lesser does he have self-esteem problems?" "What does a Lesser Prairie Chicken do?" "Why are they so important?" "Do they perform a highly valued purpose or are they the James Bond of the chicken world?"

The people that invited me to the meeting were up in arms because they had land they wanted to put wind turbines on and they were being held up by a little, bitty bird.

They went on to explain that pictures of the LPC (Lesser Prairie Chicken) were hard to find and they were even harder to find when hunting them. It was explained to me that the LPC only flew a few feet off the ground and often flew into fence posts and other objects in their way.

Of course, this brought other questions to mind, "How can a bird that only flies a few feet off the ground be harmed by a wind turbine that is really high off the ground?" "Do they have bird optometrists so we can get them some glasses or contacts?" "Will there be a run on tiny bird helmets for them?"

I attended the meeting with my notepad in hand and camera around my neck. Representatives of the Department of Justice and the Fish & Wildlife Service were seated at a long table

up front with a picture of a LPC prominently displayed behind them.

The audience of 150-200 farmers and ranchers were on hand to make their plight known. In fact, the representatives were looking a bit worried that they might be the hunted instead of the LPC.

After a brief but passionate overview from the LPC representatives the audience got their chance to be heard. They were very vocal and had no problem telling the officials they were completely off base.

No one was really listening to the officials and the officials were dismissing the farmers and ranchers.

I walked away with a story and scratching my head wondering how this would turn out.

After all this time, the U.S. Justice Department is dropping the appeal of a federal court ruling in Texas that removed the Lesser Prairie Chicken from the federal protections of the Endangered Species Act.

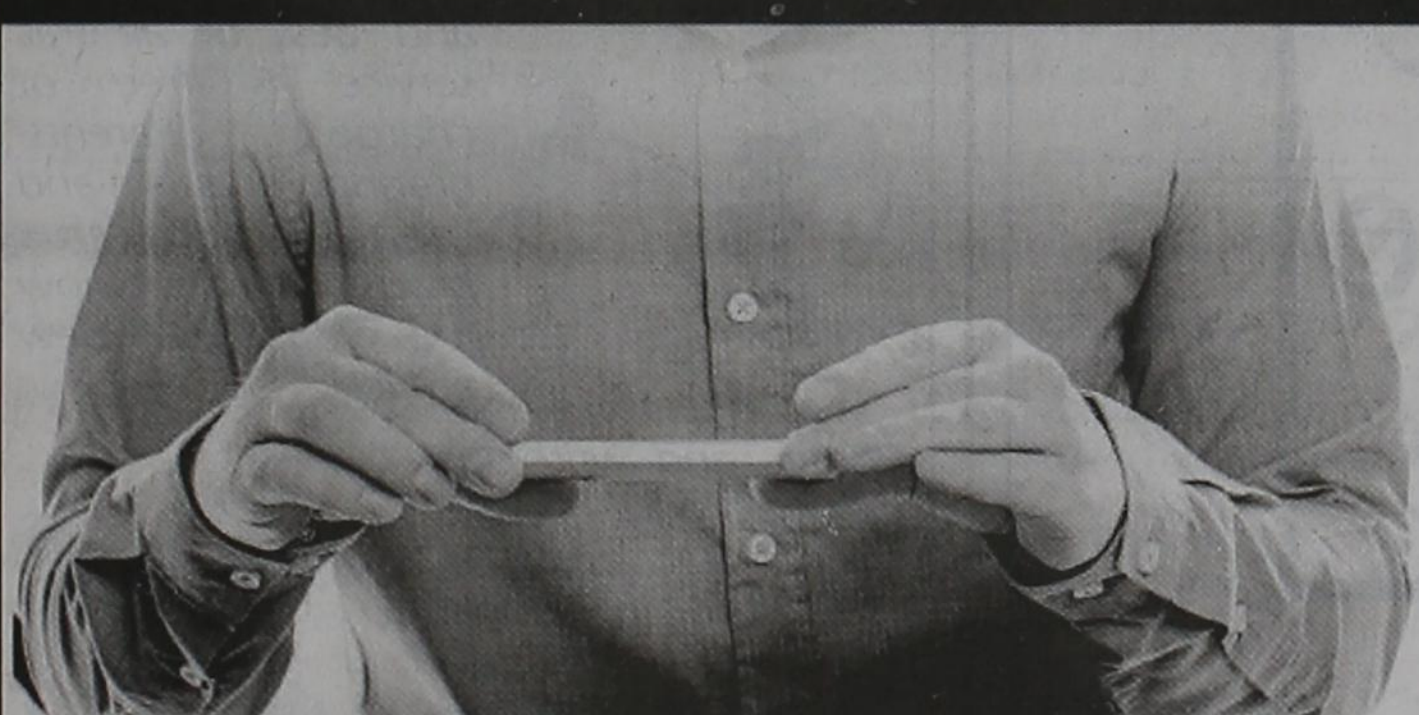
According to reports from U.S. Representative Randy Neugebauer, the evaluation that took place prior to listing the LPC as being threatened was flawed.

I am still scratching my head and wondering how a tiny little bird caused such a monumental uproar. I am also wondering if they are no longer on the Endangered Species list will there be deep fried Lesser Prairie Chicken on a menu anytime soon.

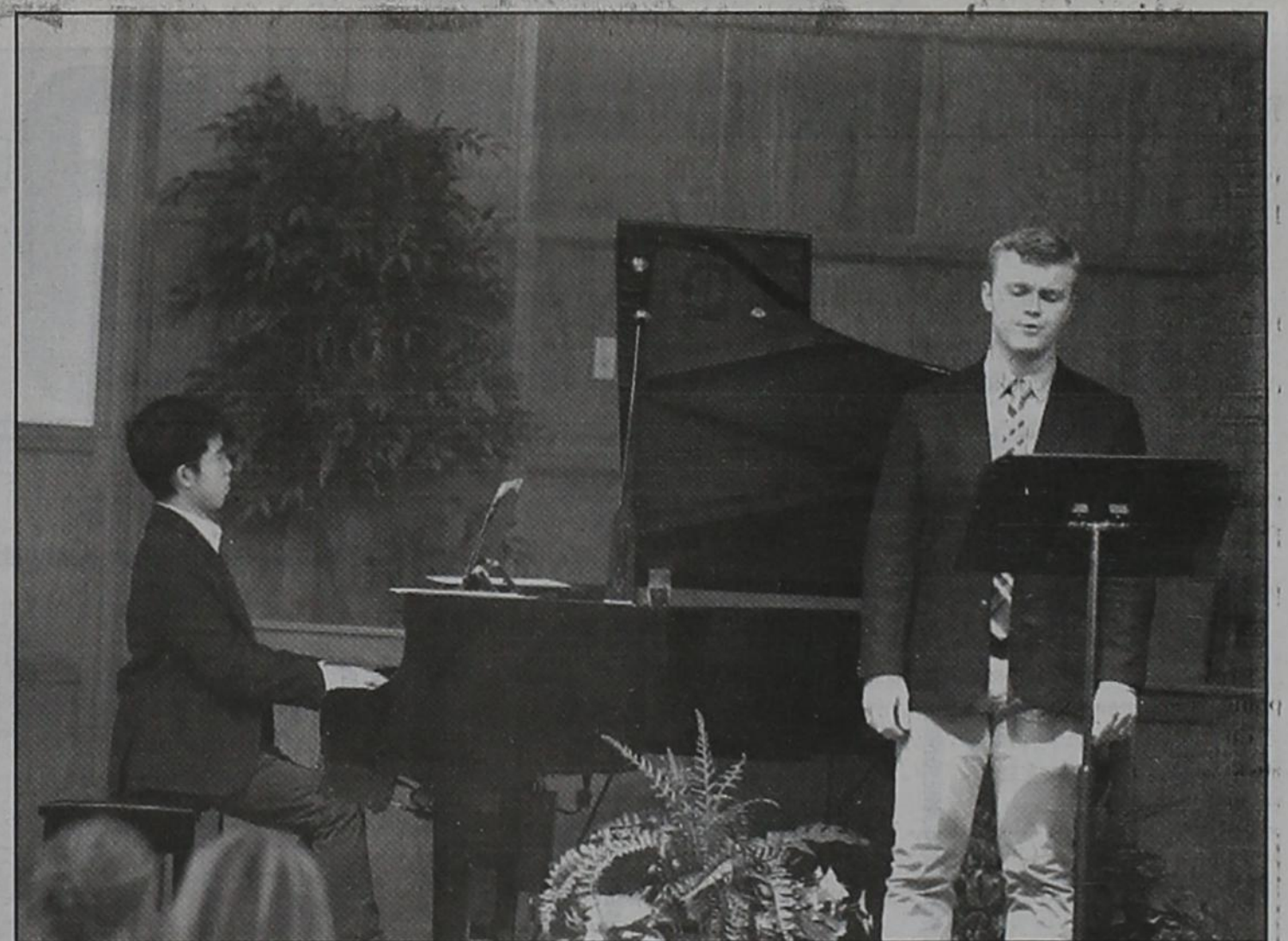

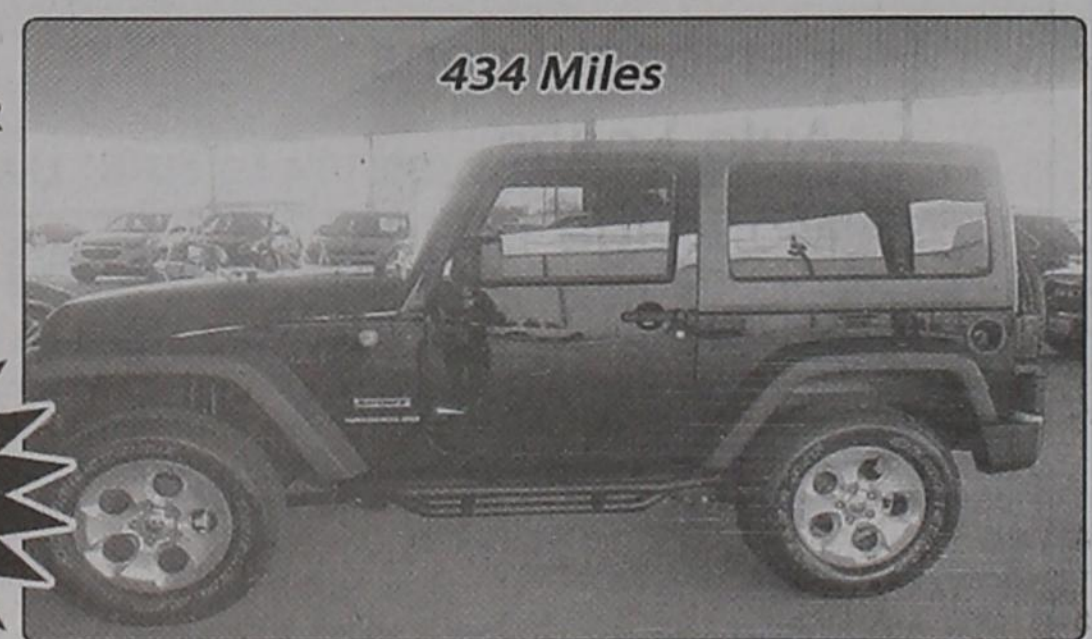

Is such motivation in your thought process? God created you for a purpose, to live with Him and glorify Him, which results in living so that others will revere His holy name, and come to know Him personally through Jesus Christ, for the sake of His holy name.

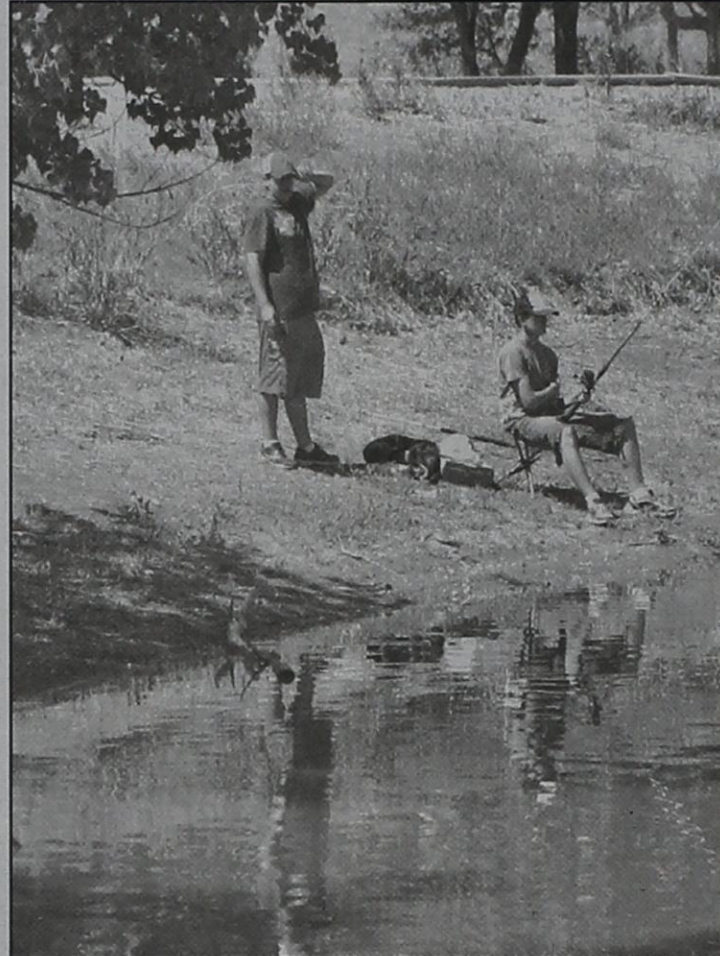
