What motivates God to do what He does and be who He is? Have you ever considered this perplexing question, and realized that maybe your motives for what you do should reflect God's heart as well. Although this question could be answered with a handful of biblical answers, Ezekiel 36 really zeroes in on one of the major motives of God.

This passage is given in the context of faithless Judah experiencing the judgment of God for their generations of idolatry and wickedness. Even in God's judgment He was patient and kind, but they did reach the end of His kindness and met His judgment. Even despite their sin, God declares that He was eventually going to bless them and restore them in a mighty way, but it is not because of they are deserving or because He owes it to them. In fact, in verses 21, 22-23, and 32 God makes clear that He is going to act "for the sake of My Holy Name." Think about that. The Jews had profaned the Lord's name and reputation terribly, yet God's motive in graciously restoring them was for the sake of His name.

If God's motive for acting was for the sake of His name, when was the last time you did something, or didn't do something sinful, because of the shame or glory it would bring upon His holy name? Is such motivation in your thought process? God created you for a purpose, to live with Him and glorify Him, which results in living so that others will revere His holy name, and come to know Him personally through Jesus Christ, for the sake of His holy name.
