most states, it is 'winner takes most states, it is 'winner takes
all' of the state's official electoral votes. A couple of states distribute proportionately. Therefore, it is possible to win by a narrow margin in the popular vote, and because of the winner takes all, to take a more decisive win in the electoral college or official result. There are 538 electoral votes and the magic number needed
to win is 270 electoral votes. Have you heard that number lately?
