Superior Completes Mississippian Lime **Opener In Borden**

The Superior Oil Company and Intex Oil Company have reported the completion of their No. 15-535 Wallace H. Jones as a natural flowing discovery from a Mississippian lime in Northeast Borden County.

A potential of 293 barrels of 41.2-gravity oil was filed with the Railroad Commission of Texas. The flow was gauged through a 16/64-inch choke. No water was made with the oil. Gas-oil ratio

was 645-1. Completion was from open hole at 8,175-8,195 feet. Pay was topped

at 8,173 feet. The new oiler is two and one-half miles northwest of Fluvanna and

two miles southwest of the Winfield. That field has only one producer It was completed in 1949 as a small pumper from pay in the Missis-sippiah lime at 8,220-60 feet.

Exact location of the new discovery is 660 fee' from south and 1,980 feet from east lines of section 535, block 97, H&TC survey. That puts it one mile west of the Borden-Scurry County line.





GOP Strategy Charts

Although the Republican convention is more than a year off, men in both the conservative and liberal wings of the party already are poring over strategy charts for the GOP presidential nomination.

The 1952 conclave promises to be the hottest fight since 1940, when Wendell Willkie, a former Democrat and a newcomer to politics, swept the board.

As of this writing, the two leading names for next year are Senator Robert A. Taft of Ohio and Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower. Lesser candidates are Gov. Earl Warren of California and Harold E. Stassen, president of the University of Pennsylvania.

Taft, of course, must be placed in the conservative group, even though he goes it alone on many issues. Eisenhower, whose own intentions are not known, is the choice of the liberals.

On the surface, the contest looms simply as a decision between these two men. But actually it's more complex than that.

First, as the recent GOP meeting in Tulsa showed, there still are many doubters among the conservatives about Taft's vote-getting ability. There is fear that his smashing 430,000-vote triumph in Ohio last Fall was a special case, not necessarily indicative of what he could do on a national scale.

From Washington and other quarters one occasionally hears the refrain. "we can win with anyone," sung by Republicans confident that the MacArthur affair, the RFC mess, the crime investigations in big cities and similar disclosures have hopelessly sunk the Democrats. But these optimists are not too numerous.
