





After that, Marshal Tito, who disinherited himself from the Soviet family and has had a Russian gun at his back, more or less, ever since, spoke up to his erstwhile Uncle Joe in vigorous words about mass murder and genocide. Tito is still a Communist, but not a Stalin Communist, and he appealed to the Poles to follow Yugoslavia's escape from the Soviet grip.

At the same time, Stalin's Deputy Premier Molotov was.in Poland, blasting Tito and trying to scare any Titominded Poles back into line by nabbing nine high-ranking Polish officers for treason.



Truth Of Yalta Lies Between The Pro And Anti Extremists

NEA Washington Correspondent
WASHINGTON—In the light of hindsight, there is no particular point in trying to defend the Yalta agreement of February, 1945, except for the historical record. The Yalta agreement, made by President Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill and Premier Stalin, brought Russia into the war against Japan. In a secret agreement not made

For the sake of argument, admit that all these concessions to Russia were bad. Admit also that President Roosevelt was in poor health and not in possession of the facility for hard political bargaining which he showed in his prime.

Granting, then, that the agree ments made at Yalta were all a mistake, there still remains one important question for consideration in any attempt at an impartial appraisal of the results of Yalta today. This question is: What difference would it have made if there had been no Yalta? Russians Recoup 1964 War Less

First recall the terms of Yaltathe price paid for Russian agreement to enter the war against Japan. The main text is only a little over 300 words long. Its main points are these:

1. There would be no change in the status of Outer Mongolia. (By a treaty of 1924, Russia had recognized Chinese sovereignty over the area. But Russia later claimed it was under rule of the Mongolian People's Republic, a Chinese Communist-Soviet satellite state.)

2. Russia was given the rights it held in northeast Asia prior to the 1904 war with Japan. These included possession of southern Sakhalin Islands were given to Russia outright. Russia was to get back her naval base rights at Port Arthur. Dairen was to be made an international port, with Russian interests pre-eminent. 3. The Chinese Eastern and South

Manchurian railroads terminating at Dairen were to be eperated by a joint Soviet-Chinese Russia having preeminent interests (Roosevelt apparently meant this last provision to cover only traffic rights. The Russians took it to mean preeminent economic rights.)

4. China was to retain full sovereignty in Manchuria. (This is the most misunderstood and the most misrepresented point in the whole Yalta agreement. Critics of Yalts



DALLAS -(P)- The man who allegedly made some of the bombs hurled in the year-long South Dallas series of bombings of negro homes was arrested by police and Texas Rangers early Wednesday.

A 50-year-old Latin American resi-

dent of the area where the bombings were centered signed a written statement at 2:30 a.m. admitting his part in the race disturbances, they said. Ranger Cant Bob Crowder Deputy Police Chief Harry T. Riddell headed the questioning which brought about the third arrest in the case now under special grand jury investigation as the result of a series of bombings of property owned by negroes.

The grand jurors stood recessed for the week after taking testimony from several property owners in the district Tuesday.

With the new arrest, investigators now believe they know who made the bombs which damaged several residences and buildings, and who tossed them from automobiles under the cloak of darkness.

Claude T. Wright, 42, and his half-brother, Arthur Eugene Young, 62, have been charged as the actual bombers, and both are in jail
